The Importance of God's Word

The Word of God is profound. It is **important** because it **teaches** and **instructs** His people. Word is truth and instructs man on *what he should rightly do*. Man knows in his sinful heart that he needs a word from God. Without that Word, man is **lost** and does not do what God requires of him; he finds himself **disobedient** to the Word of God to his peril.

Characteristics of true expository preaching/teaching:

- takes and <u>systematically</u> explains the text in the general order and context in which it appears.
- preaches/teaches through <u>chapters, sections</u> and books of the Bible.
- allows the <u>text</u> to determine both the content and structure of the message derived from it.
- is <u>not</u> topical but many topics will be covered in due time as the Word is unfolded.
- is true to the <u>original meaning</u> of the text.
- uses <u>illustrations</u> and examples that are biblical and relevant
- seeks to <u>apply</u> the principles and truths drawn from the text to the needs to the contemporary audience
- exhorts and challenges people to respond in <u>obedience</u> to the message of God's Word
