- B. God spared not His own Son.

- II. The Recipients for us all
 - A. The for us all does not refer to all people head-for-head, but only the elect.
 - B. The word all is important here also.

III. The Blessing

- A. How shall he not not with him also freely give us all things?
- B. The idea here is that Paul argues from the greater to the lesser to expose and reveal the heart of God toward us all.
