- I. The Magnitude of God's Judgment (34)
 - A. A world to the whole earth
 1. All its human inhabitants and the earth itself
 2. Particular, yet global
 - B. Observe the totality of God's judgment
 1. All the nations (2)
 2. All the armies (2)
 3. Utterly destroyed (2-3)
 - a. Rotting corpses
 - b. Mountains drenched in blood
 4. Host of heaven destroyed (4)
 5. "Devoted to destruction" (5)
 6. Animals (for sacrifice and economy) destroyed as well (7)
 7. Land decimated (7-9)
 8. Smoke goes up forever (10)
 9. Eternally desolate (10)
 10. Only "uncleanness" will dwell there (11-17)
 11. Nothing noble will abide there any longer (12)
- II. The Greater Magnitude of God's Redemption (35)
 - A. A word to "Zion"
 1. Notice the distinction
 2. Global, yet particular
 - B. Observe the fullness of redemption
 1. Desert will blossom
 - a. Flowing rivers
 - b. Flowering plants

- c. Rejoicing and joy
 - d. Majesty and worship
 2. A word to the anxious
 - a. God will come with vengeance
 - b. You will be saved
 3. Notice the healing
 - a. Blind will see
 - b. Deaf will hear
 - c. Lame will leap
 - d. Mute will shout
 - e. Drought will end
 - f. The end of foolishness and the establishment of Holiness
 - g. Freedom from violence
 4. The "return" of the ransomed
 - a. Shouting
 - b. Everlasting joy
 - c. Gladness
 - d. No sorrow
