This Sunday at CMPC...

This Sunday we return to our study of *Revelation: Strength for Today, Hope for Tomorrow* as Pastor John takes a look at Revelation 14.6-13 and *You Bet Your Life*. Remember... Daylights Savings Time ends this Sunday and we need to set our clocks back one hour- an extra hour for rest! Then on Sunday evening we conclude the Lord's Day in worship at 6:30 and Pastor Ben will be looking at Luke 10.1-16 in our ongoing series *Luke: Becoming Certain About the Story*.

There are several things to remind you about that are coming up. First, please note that Kennedy Smartt's 98th birthday is this coming Monday, November 7th. If you'd like to send him a card, please contact the Church. Speaking of Kennedy, our next blood drive is set for Wednesday, November 16th. What gift can you give a 98-year-old? One would certainly be to give the gift of your blood in his honor. Quite frankly, since Kennedy has not been able to head the blood drives here at CMPC, the number of donors has dropped precipitously. We use to have between 60-80 people regularly giving blood. Your blood is still desperately needed. Please join the 24 who have already signed up in the narthex!

Also, please note that this Sunday is designated as the *International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church*. While we regularly pray for the Persecuted Church here at CMPC, the bulletin will contain a helpful insert to give us a roadmap for our own prayer lives.

Our hymns Sunday morning align with our scripture text emphasis on God's glory in creation. We've certainly seen that glory in the splendid fall colors of the changing leaves against the backdrop of the blue autumn skies. We will gather to worship with *Psalm 57. 9-11, Be Exalted, O God.* Whenever we sing the psalms, we join our voices with what the church has been singing for 3000 years! Our hymn of praise will be *Before Jehovah's Awesome Throne*. This is Isaac Watts' 18th century paraphrase of Psalm 100; we use a late 20th century tune. Our hymn of testimony is a late 20th century hymn, *God All Nature Sings Thy Glory*. Then we will respond to God's word with the 21st century Townend/Getty hymn, *Across the Lands*.

As we are praying, please pray for our nation. The hymns we sing this Sunday are counter-cultural- the truths we will proclaim in song are radically opposed by the secular world. Pray for the upcoming election (and remember the Fellowship Hall is being used Monday night and all day Tuesday); and please pray for God to revive his church.

Angel 1, 6-7

- Proclamation, 6-7
 - Eternal gospel: the good news of what Christ has accomplished through his life, death and resurrection
 - o For all people: fulfilling the Abrahamic covenant
 - o Fear God and Give him glory: this is the language of repentance: see the story of Achan
 - The prime sin of the nations: refusing to worship God
 - Hour of judgment has come
 - Worship him who is the Creator
 - These four divisions (heaven and earth, the sea and the springs of water) were all the specific targets in the trumpets and the bowls; hence, a reminder of God's judgment

- The Fall of Babylon, 8
 - o Babylon- Rome, Jerusalem, a new Babylon, some other global city- or the city of man in general most likely
 - Represents the center of false worship
 - Emphasis on the sin of sexual immorality
 - Notorious sin in Rome
 - Idolatry is spiritual sexual immorality
 - All materialistic and self-seeking ways (sexual immorality is always about self-seeking)
 - Sexual rebellion is the greatest rebellion against God today

Angel 3, 9-11

- Judgment
 - Worship of the beast linked to God's wrath
 - o This worship will be shown for what it is in contrast to the worship of God
- "Full strength in the cup of his anger"
 - o Note: Jesus also drank the cup of God's wrath on our behalf
 - o Our sin will be punished- it is all about who receives the punishment
- Verses 10-11: where is this happening?
 - o Burning sulfur, cf. Job 18
 - Worse than we can comprehend
 - Tormented in the presence of the Lamb
 - The holiness and justice of God must be kept in view
 - Forever and ever:
 - Eternal torment
 - In the presence of the Lamb!
 - Eternal torment is NOT at the hand of Satan- he is eternally tormented
 - No rest: when you just want to close your eyes...
