THE PRIESTHOOD OF ALL BELIEVERS

(Part 19 – series on Baptist Distinctives)

TEXT: John 20:22,23; Matthew 23:8,9

INTRODUCTION: As Baptists, we share with historic Protestants in repudiating the Roman Catholic heresies associated with the man-made hierarchy of a human priesthood. There is only "one God and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (1 Tim. 2:5). It is wicked presumption and blasphemy for any other **man** to claim to forgive sins. The doctrine of the "priesthood of all believers," rightly understood, does not contradict Christ's unique prerogative to forgive sins.

Let us examine and refute from Scripture the heresies arising from the abuse of this blessed doctrine. Tradition must not trump the Word of God.
