

"Fruitfulness"

The Fruit Loop Genesis 49:22-27

God supplies:

I. Health - "Joseph is a fruitful bough"

(vs. 22-23)

So that we can:

A. Perdure - " a fruitful bough "

To continue or last permanently

Persecution - "sorely grieved him"

B. Provide -"by a well"

Peril - "shot at him"

C. Produce - "branches run over"

Pain - "hated him"

II. Help - "the God of thy father, who shall help thee" (vs. 24-26)

So that we have:

A. Stability - "the shepherd, the stone of Israel"

B. Strength -"by the Almighty, who shall bless thee"

C. Sufficiency – "blessings of thy father have prevailed above"

III. Harvest - "Benjamin shall ravin" (v. 27)

So that we enjoy:

A. Catching - "shall ravin as a wolf"

B. Consuming – "In the morning he shall devour the prey"

C. Contributing - "at night he shall divide the spoil"

Sentence Sermon:

"Our fruit is the direct result of our abiding."
