

"God's Hand"

Does that Thing Exodus 9:1-12

The hand of the LORD is on:

I. People - "the LORD shall do this thing in the land" (vs. 1-5) *He works among those He*:

- A. Possesses -"Let my people go, that they may serve me"
- **B.** Permits "For if thou refuse to let them go"
- C. Protects "the LORD shall sever between"

II. Possessions - "the LORD did that thing" (vs. 6-7)

He works in a manner that is:

- A. Timely "on the morrow"
- **B.** Targeted "all the cattle of Egypt died"
- C. Testimonial "And Pharaoh sent, and behold"

III. Pain - "a boil breaking forth with blains" (vs. 8-12)

He works through what:

- A. Hurts "They took the ashes of the furnace"
- **B.** Humbles "the magicians could not stand before Moses"
- C. Hardens "the LORD hardened the heart of Pharaoh"
