Heidelberg Catechism, Question 113. What does the tenth commandment require of us? Answer. That not even the slightest thought or desire contrary to any of God's commandments should ever arise in our heart. Rather, with all our heart we should always hate all sin and delight in all righteousness.

"Homosexual act and homosexual desire, by either male or female, are a violation of [God's] creation ordinance and are thus sinful. As such the church must warn and rebuke those who call themselves Christians but persist in homosexual practice and the church must actively teach that homosexual affection is sinful. It can never suggest that there is a morally neutral, constitutional, homosexual orientation."

"We hold that there is always sin in the saints, until they are freed from their mortal frame, because *depraved concupiscence resides in their flesh*, and is at variance with rectitude. . . Whenever there is a desire, whenever a man says, "I wish I had..." even though he immediately rejects it and does not surrender to it, he is nevertheless guilty of coveting."
