The Stone the Builders Rejected (1 Peter 2:6-8)

- Does "unbelief" nullify the power and purpose of the Gospel?
- Peter dealt with unbelief before the Sanhedrin & now among the pagans
- Peter writes to the Gentile Christians to encourage them to trust Christ
- God has laid his corner stone in Zion, a chief cornerstone, elect, precious

I. If You Believe in Christ, the Stone: You Can't Lose

Peter is drawing from several OT texts to encourage persecuted believers
Isaiah 28: 16 – "those who trust" in the Lord will not be put to shame
Peter says: corner stone is precious & building life on Him secures you
Peter says – if you trust in Jesus and life for Him you cannot lose

II. If You Disbelieve the Stone: You Can't Win

- There are those who will not believe, who reject Christ as the cornerstone

 Vs 7b The stone which the builders rejected, Has become the chief

 cornerstone."
- What effect does this have on God's plan or purpose absolutely none!
- Human unbelief does not frustrate / defeat the ultimate purposes of God.

III. "Unto This You Were Appointed"

"To this—this stumbling, this disobedience—they were appointed."

- Key point: even man's very unbelief is under God's sovereign control
- Jesus Christ is glorified either way, if we believe & if we don't believe
- If we believe: prove Him to be the precious stone that He really is
- If we disbelieve: prove His sovereign power, still accomplish His purpose
