Course taught by:

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I. GOD PREDICTS THE FUTURE -- An Introduction

The word "eschatology" is the theological term used to describe the Bible's prophetic doctrine about the Last Days ("*eschatos*" = last [end]; "*logos*" = word or teaching). Hence, "eschatology" is teaching about the last days of this age and about the glorious eternity to follow.

"The study of Bible prophecy is fascinating and profitable. God has seen fit to draw aside the curtain of the future and to reveal enough of His heavenly plan to inspire His children with confidence and hope. Let us approach our study with joyous expectation" -- Charles Woodbridge

A. The <u>Importance</u> of Studying Eschatology

What is the <u>purpose</u> for studying prophecy?

1. To <u>teach</u> us what God's plans are

A knowledge of Bible prophecy "provides the believer with an <u>optimistic</u> philosophy if history" (Alva McClain)

2. To inspire us about the greatness of God (Is. 46:9-11)

(He is omniscient [He knows all] and He is sovereign [He controls all])

3. To <u>assure</u> us of the <u>unity</u> and <u>reliability</u> of Scripture

A vast portion of the Bible is given to predictive prophecy. It is said that 333 distinct prophecies were literally and exactly fulfilled at the <u>first</u> coming of Christ (the chances of this happening by accident have been computed as 1 in 87,000--plus 90 more zeros).

For <u>every</u> verse speaking of Jesus' <u>first</u> coming in Scripture, there are <u>eight</u> which speak of His second coming.

4. To <u>encourage</u> us to be <u>faithful</u> to God and His Word

God's future program is a source of:

- a. <u>Comfort</u> to the <u>sorrowing</u> Christian (I Thess. 4:13-14; John 14:1-4)
- b. <u>Strength</u> to the Christian enduring <u>testing</u> (II Cor. 4:14-18; Rom. 8)
- c. <u>Warning</u> to the <u>lazy</u>, <u>unfaithful</u> Christian (II Cor. 5:9, 10)
- d. <u>Correction</u> to the Christian who places too much value on this <u>life</u> (II Peter 3:10-12)
- e. <u>Reproof</u> to the Christian who becomes doctrinally careless (II Thess. 2:5; II Pet. 1:19)
- f. <u>Cleansing</u> for the Christian who keeps his eyes on Christ and His future glory (I Jn. 3:2-3) (cp. W.E. Blackstone, <u>Jesus is Coming</u>, p. 180)
- 5. To <u>wake us up</u> to realize the extreme urgency of the hour in which we live (Rom. 13:11-12). God's longsuffering is so that others might be saved (II Pet. 3:8-9, 15)
- 6. To <u>prepare</u> us for the most dreadful time of persecution in human history -- the 70th week of Daniel (commonly called "The Tribulation Period") (Rev. 14:12)
- 7. To <u>bless</u> us with God's revelation about the future (Rev. 1:3)

B. The <u>Method of Studying</u> Bible Prophecy

- 1. Pray for the <u>Holy Spirit</u> to teach you His Word
- 2. Allow the <u>Bible</u> to formulate your system of beliefs (your theology), rather than forcing your pre-supposed beliefs into the Bible (SEE: Appendix: "A Biblicist's View Toward the Bible")
- 3. Interpret the Bible <u>literally</u>

(Take God's Word for what it says, rather than allegorizing the Bible and dreaming up a deeper, hidden meaning that cannot be proven by the context, grammar, or by an accurate comparison with other Scripture)

- 4. Remember that God has <u>not</u> necessarily revealed <u>all the details</u> of His plan yet (Rev. 10:4)
- 5. Understand the <u>unique features</u> of Bible prophecy
 - a. <u>Not</u> all prophetic passages are <u>chronological</u> (cp. Rev. 11 with 12:1-5)
 - b. Often there are <u>time gaps</u> in prophecy (that were not discernable to the prophet himself) (Is. 9:6-7, 61:1-2; cp. Lk. 4:18-20; Dan. 9:24-27)
 - c. Often, future events are recorded as if they had already occurred (EX: Is. 9:6, 5:13, 53:12). Why?
 - 1) To express the <u>certainty</u> of fulfillment (Is. 46:10)
 - 2) To express the <u>viewpoint</u> of the prophet who was seeing the vision of the future (EX: Rev. 20:15)

C. The <u>Amazing Accuracy</u> of Bible Prophecy

Only God can predict the future!

- 1. The <u>Omniscience</u> of God has foretold His plan (Is. 14:24; 44:28-45:1, 13; 46:9-10)
- 2. The <u>Soveriegnty</u> of God will accomplish His plan (Is. 46:10b-11)
- 3. The <u>Inspiration</u> of the Holy Spirit has recorded His plan (II Tim. 3:16; II Pet. 1:20-21)
