5C The vision of the basket of summer fruit chap 8 (judgment imminent)

THEME: God's patience with His people has run out, and judgment will fall.

Key verse: Amos 5:15 Hate the evil, love the good, and establish judgment in the gate: it may be that the LORD God of hosts will be gracious unto the remnant of Joseph.
