Series: Hebrews 4:8-11

1. Sadly, many Christians have not heard the New Covenant taught as much as the Old Covenant. However, the thrust of the Old Covenant is to point to the final and ultimate Covenant that would be made and kept by the Messiah. Read Jeremiah 31:31-34. This text speaks a lot about the New Covenant. Now look at Hebrews 8. What truths can be gained from Hebrews 8 about the New Covenant?

- **2.** Please read over the following passages and see what truths are taught about the New Covenant.
 - A. Luke 22:20
 - B. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26
 - C. 2 Corinthians 3:1-6
 - D. Hebrews 10:15-18
- **3.** Under the New Covenant there is no commandment that we are to abstain from any and all work on Sundays. Nor is there the accompanying punishment of death or excommunication from the church. We have much freedom as to how we spend Saturdays and Sundays. However, could it still be wise to not overfill our schedules with regular work on Sundays? Why or why not?
- **4.** Some Christians struggle greatly with knowing exactly what to do with all of the laws given to the Israelites during the exodus. Such questions arise like, "Are we still required to keep the sabbaths, the festivals, the food laws, etc.?" How does understanding types and anti-types, shadows and substance help with your understanding of these things under the New Covenant?
- **5.** Today, if someone were to ask you if you are required to keep the Sabbath what would you say that would help with their understanding and to see their need for Christ?
