What is 'discontenment'?

A longing for something better than the present situation.

Three ways in which discontentment, if not properly handled, can harm the witness of the church:

Discontentment can lead to complaining and grumbling

"Do all things without grumbling or disputing, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world."

- **Philippians 2:14-15**

Discontentment can lead to complaining and grumbling

"Do not complain, brothers and sisters, against one another, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing right at the door."

- Pray for those that you dislike and for God to change your heart
- Realize God's love for those who are hard to like
