- Principle #1: Children are a blessing.
- Principle #2: Children are a stewardship from God.
- Principle #3: Children are to be brought up in the training and admonition of the Lord.
- Principle #4: Children are to be brought up in an atmosphere of love.

## Principle #5: A major part of child training is the reality of consequences.

- Definition: "something that follows from an action or condition."
- Consequences to be considered in stages: home/world/final judgment (2Corinthians 5:10).
- The rod is one of the ordained means of God to help restore that image in wisdom and righteousness.

## I. COMMON REASONS THE USE OF THE ROD IS NEGLECTED.

- A. Laziness
- **B.** False Sentimentality
- C. Fear Of Abuse

#### II. SEVERAL PRINCIPLES IN THE USE OF THE ROD:

- Qualify: there is no "one size fits all", as our children are not machines. They are each unique.
  - A. It is to be Used with the Authority of God
  - B. It is to be Used in an Atmosphere Of Love
  - C. It is to be Used with a View to the Heart
  - D. It is to be Used with Instruction
  - E. It is to be Used with a Desire to Restore Fellowship
  - F. It is to be Used Predominantly in the Formative Period
  - G. It is to be used to Produce Pain, Not Injury
  - H. It is to be Used with Self-Control
  - The rod should be administered with righteous anger not sinful (uncontrolled). Not "pressure cooker" use.
  - If sinful anger is aroused, then either establish something in the procedure that calms you down or wait.
  - I. It is to be Used with Consistency
  - No "countdown", but must take heed to the voice the first time. We will consider in our next study this possibility of gracious appeal.
  - If we make a threat, we must think ahead and be willing to follow through; to not do so is to lie to our children
  - It should be consistent in the agreement of the parents. If divided, there will be trouble.

## J. It is to be Used with Discernment

- (1.) Make a distinction between forgetfulness, and high-handed sins.
- (2.) Beware of rebellion shown in adherence to the letter, but not the spirit of the law.
- (3.) There must be a wise discerning of the individuality of each child.
- Age, gender, temperament, present understanding, etc.
- (4.) Beware of undue shame in disciplining in front of others.
- (5.) Realize that the majority of the formative work is done in the home, not in public.
- There can be a frustration experienced when they act up when with others, and a tendency to overreact.
- (6.) Beware of avoiding those things which will cross the will of the child.
- Sometimes the parents can live in a dread to offend the child, and end up catering to them.
- While we are not to provoke them to wrath unduly.

# K. It Is To Be Used In Faith

- Even when we don't see the immediate results we would desire (like evangelism, preaching, etc)
- it is to be used with prayerfulness to God to bless the means, and an enduring consistency that doesn't give up
- <u>The hope</u> is that through this method, God would bless so that there might be development not only an obedient child, but one who has true wisdom in the fear of the Lord.
- As they get older, there should be a decline in the use of this method (Tripp's chart). If there continue to be problems, then another method could be used. This we will consider in our next study.
