## "Whom The Lord Loveth . . . " Jonah 4:7-9

## Introduction:

- 1. Lets Head Back This Morning To The Last Chapter Of Jonah:
  - Jonah Chapter 4!
    - Where We Are Absolutely Amazed At The Change That Has Taken Place In Jonah!
      - Amazed & Dumfounded!
  - For God Had Just Used Jonah:
    - In One Of The Greatest Spiritual Awakenings In The History Of The World!
      - In Chapter 3 The Entire City Of Nineveh Known For Its Greatness & Its Wickedness Repented From Their Sin & Turned To The Lord!
    - And Instead Of Destroying Them:
      - God Showed Them Mercy!
  - And Jonah Had A Front Row Seat Through It All!
    - But Instead Of Rejoicing For The Ninevites:
      - We Read In 4:1 "But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was very angry!"
    - For Whatever Reason:
      - Jonah Wanted Nineveh To Experience God's Judgment Instead Of His Mercy!
    - And As One Writer Puts It "Jonah Shows Himself To Be A Man Still In Human Skin, Prone To Wander And Sin!" (Estelle)
- 2. And Now All Through Chapter 4:
  - God's Attention Is Back On Jonah!
    - Because It Is Clear That Something Was Still Missing!
      - God Was After Jonah's Heart!
    - And In This Chapter:
      - We See Not Only How The Lord Deals With Jonah, But Often How He Deals With Us, When Things Are Still Missing In Our Hearts!
  - First The Lord Approached Jonah:
    - With A Gracious Question!
      - In 4:4 "Then Said The Lord, Doest Thou Well To Be Angry?"
    - A Simple / Quiet Question:
      - To Get Jonah To Stop & Think About The Condition Of His Heart!
    - But No Answer Is Recorded To The Lord's Question:
      - At Least No Words Recorded!
      - But His Response Is Recorded In 4:5, When He Sits Down To "See What Would Become Of The City!"
  - Then The Lord Approached Jonah:
    - With A Gracious Provision!
      - In 4:6 God Provided A Special Plant To Give Jonah Comfort & Relief!
        - And Through This Plant God Proved To Jonah The Truth About His Character!
      - That He Really Is:
        - "A Gracious God, And Merciful, Slow To Anger, And Of Great Kindness!" (4:2)
      - But How Did Jonah Respond:
        - To The Lord's Goodness To Him?
        - In The Words Of 4:6:
          - "So Jonah Was Exceeding Glad For The Gourd!"
      - Jonah Was Happy About The Provision!
        - But His Heart Was Still Closed To The Provider!
  - So Now, The Lord Will Approach Jonah:
    - With His Gracious Correction!
      - Which We Read About In 4:7-9 "But God prepared a worm when the morning rose the next day, and it smote the gourd that it withered. / And it came to pass, when the sun did arise, that God prepared a vehement east wind; and the sun beat upon the head of Jonah, that he fainted, and wished in himself to die, and said, It is better for me to die than to live. / And God said to Jonah, Doest thou well to be angry for the gourd? And he said, I do well to be angry, even unto death!"
    - Even Though God Is Now Dealing With Jonah:
      - In A More Stern & Harsh Way:

- It Is Still A Display Of His Grace & Mercy & Love!
- How Can We Know This?
  - As Hebrews 12:6 Reminds Us "For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth / correcteth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth!"
- God Shows His Love & Grace To Us:
  - Even When He Corrects & Chastens!
    - Because He Is Doing So As A Father!
  - Jonah For All Of His Faults & Failures & Sins:
    - Was Still God's Son!
- 3. Whenever We Find Ourselves To Be Like Jonah:
  - Whether Something Is Missing In Our Conduct:
    - And We Have Disobeyed The Lord!
  - Or Whether Something Is Missing In Our Character:
    - And We Are Not Reflecting God's Heart In Our Own!
  - Then Sometimes God Will Have To Chasten & Correct Us:
    - In Ways That Are Similar To What We See Here In Jonah!
  - But Remember:
    - God Is No Less Gracious:
      - When He Chastens You & Corrects You!
    - Because:
      - "Whom The Lord Loveth He Chasteneth!"
  - What Are Some Ways God May Chasten / Correct Us?
- \* Sometimes God May Chasten & Correct Us:
- 1. Through What He Removes!
  - Like What He Removed From Jonah In:
    - 4:7 "But God prepared a worm when the morning rose the next day, and it smote the gourd that it withered!"
      - In Order To Chasten Us, Sometimes The Lord Will Take Away That Which Gives Us Comfort & Delight, If Our Delight Is Not In Him!
    - Just Like He Did With Jonah!
      - What Did God Remove From Jonah?
        - The Gourd / Plant That Gave Jonah Such Relief & Delight!
  - How Did The Lord Do This?
    - "But God Prepared A Worm!"
      - Once Again We Read That Word "Prepared!"
        - This Shows Us That God Was In Complete Control Of Jonah's Situation!
      - The First Time It Was Used In This Book:
        - God Prepared A Fish! Why?
          - To Deliver Jonah!
      - The Next Time It Was Used In This Book:
        - God Prepared A Gourd! Why?
          - To Comfort & Relieve Jonah!
      - This Time:
        - God Prepared A Worm! Why?
          - To Chasten Jonah & To Wake Up His Heart!
    - And God "Prepared" This Worm:
      - Or A Beetle-Grub:
        - To Eat The Life Out Of The Plant That God Gave To Him In The First Place!
    - And Just As Quickly As The Plant Sprang Up!
      - In One Day!
      - By The Next Morning:
        - It Was Gone! But:
  - Why Did The Lord Do This?
    - So That The Gourd / Plant Would "Wither" & Die!
      - And Become Useless To Jonah!
        - No More Shade / Coolness / Oxygen / Life / Even Companionship! IE: Plants!
    - See Jonah Set His Heart On:

- Something Fragile! Like The Gourd!
- Something Futile! Like The Temporary Relief & Comfort It Provided!
- His Heart Was Not Set On Something That:
  - Would Last Forever!
- So The Lord Graciously Removed:
  - What Would Distract Jonah From Him!
    - Not Out Of Spite!
    - But Out Of Love!
  - Because The Lord Knew:
    - What Jonah Really Needed!
      - And What Would Really Comfort Jonah & Give Him Lasting Relief!
- Sometimes The Lord Needs To Do The Same For Us!
  - Sometimes He May Need To:
    - Graciously Remove What Distracts Us From Him!
  - We Must Never Forget That:
    - Anything We Have That Gives Us Comfort Or Relief Or Pleasure Comes From God!
      - And Must Never Come Before The Lord!
    - For What He Gives:
      - He Can Take Away!
  - This Is What Job Clearly Understood:
    - Job 1:21 "The Lord Gave, And The Lord Hath Taken Away; Blessed Be The Name Of The Lord!"
  - So Don't Put Your Delight In:
    - What Is Temporary!
      - Like The Comforts & Pleasures In This World!
    - But Put It In What Is Timeless!
      - Psalm 37:4 "Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart!"
- God May Chasten & Correct Us:
  - Through What He Removes From Us!
    - But Remember "Whom The Lord Loveth He Chasteneth!"
  - And As Matthew Henry Once Wrote About This Verse:
    - "Though Our Gourd Be Gone Our God Is Not Gone! And There Is Enough In Him To Make Up All Our Losses!" So Return To Him!
- \* Sometimes God May Chasten & Correct Us:
- 2. Through What He Sends!
  - Like What He Sent To Jonah In:
    - 4:8 "And it came to pass, when the sun did arise, that God prepared a vehement east wind; and the sun beat upon the head of Jonah, that he fainted, and wished in himself to die, and said, It is better for me to die than to live!"
      - In Order To Chasten Us, Sometimes The Lord Will Send Us Something That May Cause Us Pain & Discomfort!
    - Just Like He Did With Jonah!
      - What Did God Send To Jonah?
        - An Unrelenting / Unbearable Heat!
  - The Record Of His Chastening:
    - One More Time We Find That God:
      - "Prepared" Something As He Pursued Jonah!
    - This Time:
      - God "Prepared A Vehement East Wind!"
        - That Brought Even More Heat With It Than The Sun That "Beat Upon The Head Of Jonah!"
      - God Was Doing This!
        - And Was In Complete Control!
        - All To Get The Attention Of Jonah!
    - Now Usually Wind Can Be A Relief When It Is Hot!
      - But Not This Wind!

- It Was More Like A Bellows Than A Fan!
  - IE: The Blacksmith At Conner Prairie!
  - Made It Hotter / Drier / Dustier / More Miserable With Every Passing Minute!
- And There Was:
  - No Shade & No Shelter That Could Give Him Relief!
- But What Was:
- The Result Of His Chastening?
  - It Says That Jonah "Fainted!"
    - He Was Very Close To A Heat-Stroke!
  - But Even Though He "Fainted" Physically:
    - He Did Not Need To "Faint" In His Heart Before The Lord!
      - He Could Have Repented & Returned To The Lord, Even Though His Body Was So Hot & Weak & Sick!
  - See This In 2 Corinthians 4:16 Paul "For which cause we faint not; but though our outward man perish, yet the inward man is renewed day by day!"
    - This Could Have Been The Testimony Of Jonah!
    - Because God Had Already Paved The Way Back!
      - The Judgment Of Jonah's Sin Would Be Taken By Another!
    - That Is Why God Could Deal With Jonah Like A Son!
      - And Not As His Enemy!
    - And Jonah Could Return & Be Renewed!
      - In An Instant!
        - But Instead, We See:
- The Response To His Chastening:
  - Jonah "Wished In Himself To Die, And Said, It Is Better For Me To Die Than To Live!"
    - Jonah Took It Upon Himself To Tell The Lord:
      - What Was Best For Him!
      - That It Was Best For Him To Die!
  - But God, In His Grace, Was Not Yet Through With Jonah!
- The Lord Graciously Sent:
  - What Would Awaken Jonah Back To Him!
    - Not Out Of Anger!
    - But Out Of Love!
  - Because The Lord Knew:
    - What Jonah Really Needed!
      - And That His "Inward Man" Needed To Be Renewed!
- And Sometimes The Lord Needs To Do The Same For Us!
  - Sometimes He May Need To:
    - Graciously Send What Will Awaken Us Back To Him!
  - Elizabeth Prentiss, The Writer Of The Hymn: "More Love To Thee" Understood This When She Wrote These Challenging Words As A Prayer:
    - "Let Sorrow Do Its Work, Send Grief And Pain; Sweet Are Thy Messengers, Sweet Their Refrain; When They Can Sing With Me, More Love, O Christ, To Thee! More Love To Thee, More Love To Thee!"
- God May Chasten & Correct Us:
  - Through What He Sends To Us!
    - But Remember "Whom The Lord Loveth He Chasteneth!"
  - He Does So Because He Has Already Paved The Way For Us To Go Back To Him!
    - If You Have Come To Jesus Christ The Judgment Of Your Sin Has Already Been Taken Away Through Him!
      - So Now He Can Deal With You As His Son Or His Daughter!
    - And He Wants You To Return To Fellowship With Him!
- \* Sometimes God May Chasten & Correct Us:
- 3. Through What He Reveals!
  - Like What He Revealed To Jonah In:
    - 4:9 "And God said to Jonah, Doest thou well to be angry for the gourd? And he said, I do well to be angry, even unto death!"

- In Order To Chasten Us, Sometimes The Lord Will Reveal The Truth About Us, And To Bring Us Back To Him!
- Just Like He Did With Jonah!
  - What Did God Reveal About Jonah?
    - His True Heart!
- The Ouestion:
  - God Asks Jonah Another Question:
    - That Is Very Similar To His First Question!
  - He Asks:
    - "Doest Thou Well To Be Angry?"
      - Well Of Course Jonah Was Angry!
    - He Was Angry About:
      - God's Mercy To The Ninevites!
      - Found This Out In 4:1!
  - But Then God Adds This To His Question:
    - "Doest Thou Well To Be Angry For The Gourd!"
      - This Is Something New!
  - Jonah Had Been Glad "Exceeding Glad":
    - When The Gourd Was Alive!
      - And Gave Him Shade & Comfort!
  - But Now God Reveals That He Was "Angry":
    - Not At The Gourd / But For The Gourd:
      - Now That It Was Dead!
  - Jonah's Response Was The Exact Opposite:
    - Of Job's Response!
    - Instead Of:
      - "The Lord Gave, And The Lord Hath Taken Away; Blessed Be The Name Of The Lord!"
    - Jonah's Response Was More Like:
      - "The Lord Gave, And The Lord Hath Taken Away; And I'm Mad At You God, For Taking It Away!"
    - How Many Have Been Angry Like This:
      - Because Of What God Gave Them & Then Took Away?
  - With This Exposure Of His True Heart Would Jonah:
    - Finally Repent & Return To The Lord? Look At:
- The Answer:
  - "And He Said, I Do Well To Be Angry, Even Unto Death!"
    - Jonah Admits His Anger, But Sees It As A Righteous Anger Against God!
      - And The Sense Of These Words Is That He Is Almost Shouting At God & Blaming Him!
    - If Only Jonah Had Listened To The Lord The First Time He Asked This Question!
      - "Doest Thou Well To Be Angry?"
- But The Lord Graciously Revealed:
  - What Was Really Going On In His Heart!
    - Again Out Of Love!
  - Because The Lord Knew:
    - What Jonah Really Needed!
    - He Needed To Be Back In Fellowship With Him!
- And Sometimes The Lord Needs To Do The Same For Us!
  - Sometimes He May Need To:
    - Graciously Reveal What Is Really Going On In Our Hearts!
      - Sometimes Privately!
      - Sometimes Very Publically!
- God May Chasten & Correct Us:
  - Through What He Reveals About Us!
    - But Remember "Whom The Lord Loveth He Chasteneth!"
  - He Does So Because He Loves You!
    - And He Wants You To Return To Him!

## Conclusion:

- 1. These Are Just Some Of The Ways That God May Use:
  - To Chasten & Correct Us:
    - And To Bring Our Hearts Back To Him!
  - Sometimes He May:
    - Remove Something:
      - That We Love!
  - Sometimes He May:
    - Send Something:
      - That Stings!
  - Sometimes He May:
    - Reveal The Truth About Us!
      - Even Openly & For All To See!
  - But It Is All Because:
    - He Loves You & Knows What Is Best For You!
      - He Wants You To Return To Him With All Of Your Heart!
- 2. When God Is In The Process Of Correcting You:
  - Remember This:
    - "Whom The Lord Loveth He Chasteneth!"
  - The Lord Is Not Dealing With You:
    - As With An Enemy Or As An Unbeliever!
      - He Is Dealing With You As His Son Or His Daughter!
        - Because The Punishment Of Your Sin Has Already Been Paid For By The Lord Jesus On The Cross!
  - So Learn From Him!
    - And Return To Him!
      - There Is No Reason For You To Wait!
    - After All:
      - We Know The Character Of God!
- 3. That He Is:
  - "A Gracious God, And Merciful, Slow To Anger, And Of Great Kindness!"

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
