- C. Redemption "blue, and purple, and scarlet"

III. Dedication - "as statute for ever" (vs. 20-21)

Dedicated to:

- A. Lending -"that they bring thee pure oil"
- B. Lighting "to cause the lamp to burn always"
- C. Legacy "Aaron and his sons shall order it"
