## 1. The Sinfulness of Idleness (vv 6, 14-15).

- **A.** Considering the Context:
- B. The Sin Exposed: Idleness
  - **1)** The Sinfulness of Idleness
    - a) Idleness is contrary to the Light of Nature (Gen 2:15, 1:28)
    - **b)** Idleness is contrary to the Word of God (1st, 4th, 5th, 6th, 8th, 10th Commandments; Col 3:23-24)
    - c) Idleness is against the apostolic Faith delivered to the saints (2 Thes 2:15)
    - **d)** Idleness is the fount of many sins.
  - **2)** The Commonness of this Sin.

    - **a)** Undue delay or neglect in fulfilling our duties.
    - **b)** Murmuring and complaining.
    - c) Inordinate affections for entertainment over our duties

  - 4) Answering Objections
    - a) Objection 1: What about recreation?

- **C.** Church Discipline is to be carried out upon the Idle.
  - **I)** Admonition (I Thes 5:14)
  - 2) Suspension from the Lord's Table
  - 3) The Public Nature of this Discipline
- **D.** The Attitude of Church Discipline
  - **I)** With love, which is not contrary to discipline
  - 2) With the call to repentance, not gossiping amongst ourselves
  - 3) With the desire for restoration
- **E.** Uses from the Text
  - **I)** We need to recover sense of shame for sin.
  - 2) We are to repent of our idleness and look to Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of our sins.
  - 3) We are to persevere with fear and trembling.
  - **4)** We are to heed this warning now, lest we fall into idleness, or continue in and compound our sin.

5) We are to turn away from our sin, but then accordingly turn to righteousness.

## 11. The Goodness of Work (vv 7-13).

- A. Godly example of work (vv 7-9)
  - **I)** The Apostle's example
    - a) In the work of the ministry: (i) Shepherding (1 Thes 2:11);
      (ii) Preaching (1 Thes 2:9); (iii) Writing (2 Thes 3:17); (iv) Reading (2 Tim 4:13); (v) Suffering (2 Cor 11:23, 28)
    - **b)** In common work
  - 2) *Use*, Elders are to be an example as shepherds to the flock of a godly work ethic.
  - **3)** *Use*, Be godly examples to others and follow godly examples of others
- **B.** The Warning to those who do not work
  - Considering this command in light of the petition, *Give us this day our daily bread*
  - 2) The Basis of the Command (Gen 3:19a)
  - 3) The Nature of the Command Primarily about life in the Church, but the law is to be thoroughly applied in every area of life (Micah 6:8)
- C. Uses from the Point (vv 11-13)
- **I)** We are to hate evil and love good
- 2) We are to have a high value of work (v 12a)
  - **a)** We are to value all kinds of work (Pr 31:27-28)
  - **b)** We are to know and delight in the goodness of work
    - i. For it is a part of the very good creation made by God
    - **ii.** For the shortness of life reminds us of the need to be diligent in our work (Psa 90:12, 17)
    - iii. Testified to in nature by the sweetness of rest (Eccl 5:12)
    - iv. Benefit to others, particularly our posterity (Pr 13:22)
- **3)** We are to work as Christians (vv 12b-13):
  - **a)** With humility
  - **b)** With contentment
  - **c)** With endurance
  - **d)** With longevity
