- A. Moses (Deuteronomy 18:18; Psalm 99:6; Exodus 33:17-23)
- B. Elijah (1 Kings 17 – 2 Kings 2; 1 Kings 19:9-18)
- C. The Law and the Prophets

II. Exodus

- A. “His departure, which He was about to accomplish at Jerusalem” - literally His *exodus*
- B. The original Exodus
- C. The “new Exodus” promised by Isaiah (esp. chapters 40-66)
- D. The Exodus Jesus was about to accomplish

III. A glimpse of reality and the voice of God

- A. Peter & the others see Jesus as He appears in Heaven
- B. But they don’t know what to make of it
- C. The Law and the Prophets and the Psalms – all of the Scriptures
- D. We need more than a vision ... we need a Word.

IV. Listen to Him!

- A. Eyewitness material – Peter’s embarrassing input. (Acts 10:43)
- B. That Jesus is the “Word become flesh” (John 1:1-2) teaches us that picture must be explained with Word.
- C. Because Jesus *speaks*, we are taught what words are *for*: for the glorification and enjoyment of God, for the healing and reconciliation of God with human beings, and human beings with each other.
- D. Christians are against slavery.
- E. If you have not: Leave Egypt. Forsake your sins. Listen to the Son. Receive His grace.
