INTRODUCTION

We continue this morning with our study of the **King with 4 Names: *Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace***. These are not names in the sense of the names that we use for each other on a daily basis. Rather these are names that describe the character, the quality, the essence of who this child is. **And there is only one Child who was born into our world in all of history who fulfills the meaning of all these names, and we celebrate His birth at Christmas, namely Jesus.**

Before we go any further, please note the phrase ***‘to us.’*** ***“To us.”*** **To whom? To all who are the recipients of the blessing that this child will bring.** Isaiah includes himself with the company of those who are the recipients of the blessing that the child to be born and the son to be given will bring. **We don’t usually think of children being born to corporate groups of people, do we?** We don’t say that a child is being born to a group. We say a child is being born to his mother, or a child is being born into his/her family. But this child is no ordinary child. It is ***“to us”*** this child is born. It is ***“to us”*** that this son is given.
