2 Pet 3:18 But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and for ever. Amen.

Psa 92:12-14 The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree: he shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon. Those that be planted in the house of the LORD shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall still bring forth fruit in old age; they shall be fat and flourishing;

I. We are to grow in the grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

1 Pet 2:2 As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby:

GROW – To enlarge in bulk or stature, by a natural, imperceptible addition of matter, through ducts and secreting organs, as animal and vegetable bodies; to vegetate as plants, or to be augmented by natural process, as animals. Thus, a plant grows from a seed to a shrub or tree, and a human being grows from a fetus to a man.

- A. Grace is the divine influence upon the heart and life.
- B. Knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ is simply becoming more familiar with Him and knowing Him like you do another person.
- C. So the question for each of us is: "Am I growing in grace and knowledge of the LORD?"
 - 1. Have I grown in the past year? In the past month? In the past week?
 - 2. Is there a difference in how much influence God has over my everyday life? My thoughts? My opinions about things?
 - 3. Is there a difference in how well I know the Lord?
- II. Growth is a slow process.
 - A. It is such a slow process that you cannot see it happening moment by moment it is imperceptible.
 - B. Plants grow slowly.

Behold, the husbandman waiteth for the precious fruit of the earth, and hath long patience for it, – James 5:7

- C. Animals grow slowly.
- D. People grow slowly both spiritually and physically.
- III. Where there is life there will be growth.
 - A. When something isn't growing it is because there is no life there it is dead.
 - B. Life necessarily produces increase.
 - 1. Trees get bigger; grass gets taller.
 - C. But life doesn't produce growth that is like an explosion it is so slow that you can not observe it moment by moment.
 - D. Some things you can observe day by day, others week by week. garden, lawn
 - E. Other things you can't measure the growth until you go to larger intervals of time. children, trees, hair

IV. So spiritual growth is the same:

Isa 28:9 Whom shall he teach knowledge? and whom shall he make to understand doctrine? *them that are* weaned from the milk, *and* drawn from the breasts.

Isa 28:10 For precept *must be* upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, *and* there a little:

- A. True spiritual growth only happens slowly and over a long period of time.
- B. Spiritual food doesn't come in concentrated pills that instantly boost you to a higher level of spirituality. like Popeye and his spinach
 - 1. It comes in little bites that you must chew and swallow one at a time.
 - 2. It isn't a miraculous, powerful message that holds the key to spiritual strength and maturity it is the little gleanings that you get from day to day and week to week.
 - 3. It is not the one outstanding message, but the steady, faithful partaking of spiritual food that brings you to spiritual maturity.
- C. There are times of faster growth and these are usually times of great difficulty.
- D. Think of the number of meals it that takes to grow an infant to a full-grown man!
- E. Spiritual growth is the result of perseverance in seeking God.
 - 1. Feeding on his Word
 - 2. Listening to preaching
 - 3. Reading and studying on your own
- V. Spiritual growth is actually a work of God not a work of our own.

1 Cor 3:7 So then neither is he that planteth any thing, neither he that watereth; but God that giveth the increase.

- A. You may eat healthy and often, but growth is the result of life.
- B. Spiritual growth works the same way.
 - 1. As we are faithful and seeking God by adding to our knowledge of Him by his Word we find that our hearts have been enlarged.
 - 2. We also find that our understanding and vision has been enlarged.
- C. But the addition of knowledge is not spiritual growth.

Knowledge puffeth up, but charity edifieth. - 1 Cor. 8:1

- 1. Simply increasing knowledge will make you proud not spiritually mature.
- D. In order to grow spiritually God's life must be in you.

Gal 2:20 I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

E. If you are still living YOUR life there can be no spiritual growth.

Prov 4:18 But the path of the just *is* as the shining light, that shineth more and more unto the perfect day.

F. Spiritual growth actually means you diminish and God increases in your life.

John 3:30 He must increase, but I *must* decrease.

1. Spiritual growth doesn't exalt us or put us in the places for men to honor us.
