



“Passover”

*A Picture of Easter
Exodus 12:1-14*

The Passover is for:

I. Appreciation - “this day shall be unto you...” (vs. 1-2, 14)

A Time to:

- A. Reflect** – “ shall be unto you for a memorial ”
- B. Rejoice** – “ye shall keep t a feast to the LORD”
- C. Respect** - “a feast by an ordinance for ever ”

II. Application - “they shall take of the blood ” (vs. 3-11)

A Teaching about:

- A. Salvation** – “take of the blood, and strike it ”
- B. Sanctification** – “ they shall eat...unleavened bread”
- C. Service** – “with your loins girded...eat it in haste ”

III. Assurance - “against all the gods of Egypt...I am”(vs.12-13)

A Truth that God is:

- A. Real** – “I will pass through the land ”
- B. Righteous** – “I will execute judgment, I am the LORD”
- C. Resolved** – “I will pass over you”

Sentence Sermon:

“Salvation is by grace through faith applying the blood of the sinless lamb to our account.”
