#### **FOCUS**

• Primarily, we are dealing with younger children (<8). Why?</p>

• If you don't have control over your children by their age 4, you have a major uphill battle!

# WHY IS DISCIPLINE NEGLECTED?

- Culturally-imbibed idea of innate goodness of all people
- Related: governmental inclination to see it as abuse
- Christians: misunderstanding of God's sovereignty

- Our nature determines the method
- •We are made in the image of God (imago Dei).
  - More than just behavior change
  - We must not "crush" them
  - They have a conscience; use it
  - Seek to restore the image in character and behavior

- •What our goal is not
  - Not just so we can say our children are under control (pride)
  - Not so we can have a quiet, orderly house
  - Not to "cement" them into morality
  - Our ultimate goal: salvation

- Our nature determines the method
- •We are made in the image of Adam (cf. Gen. 1:26 w/ 5:1-3)
  - Children are born sinners, with the image of God defaced and unwanted.
  - Gen. 6:5; 8:21; Ps. 58:3; 51:5.

- Proverbs 22:15
  - "foolishness"
    - Not "silliness" or "immaturity"
    - Rather, to be defined as Proverbs uses the word.
    - See Psalm 5:5; 14:1; 53:1; 69:5;Proverbs 1:7; 12:5; 13:19.
    - Thus, depravity and sinfulness are bound up in your child's heart.
    - Discipline is the method to save them.

# CONCLUSIONS

- Discipline is spiritually necessary
- Discipline forces behavior contrary to nature
- Reason alone will not work
- •If you are a believer, your children are your enemies. Discipline will teach them to love you.
