Jesus Christ in the Old Testament

(Part 14 – Jesus - The Captain of the LORD's Host)

(Joshua 5:13-15 and Selected Scriptures)

Introduction: See: Joshua 5:13 - 6:2

Joshua 5:13 – Here Jesus makes one of His many mysterious appearances in the O.T.

Why is Joshua confronted by a Christophany?

--To show Joshua that he was an "<u>underling</u>" and that Christ was the Holy Commander-in-Chief (cp. I Pet. 5:4).

v.15 – "Loose thy shoe from off thy foot; for the place whereon thou standest is holy." Why is Joshua told to remove his shoe? Because he was standing on holy ground. Why was it holy ground? It is because the LORD was there.

6:2 - The Captain of the Lord's Armies is now identified as "the LORD (Yahweh)."

Note: Joshua was <u>justified</u> in conquering the nations of Canaan for three reasons: See Deut. 9:4-5

- 1. Because it was <u>God's battle</u>; Joshua and Israel were simply God's instrument to do His will (Deut. 9:4, 5 "The LORD doth drive them out")
- 2. Because of the <u>wickedness</u> of the nations (Deut. 9:4-5)
 - --Sexual perversion of every type (Lev. 18:1-30; *v. 24-25, 27)
- Because the land actually <u>belonged to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob</u> (Deut. 9:5b) Gen. 12:1; Gen. 13:15;

The Captain of the Lord's Host is the Messenger (Angel) of the LORD (Exod. 23:20-23) (Is. 63:9 - The Messenger "of His presence") *He fought for Joshua

- 1) The Lord would <u>accompany</u> Joshua and <u>promote</u> him *Joshua* 6:27
- 2) Victory at Ai

Joshua 8:1

- 3) Victory over Adoni-zedek and the kings of the Amorite coalition of Southern Canaan *Joshua 10:8; Joshua 10:12-14*
- 4) Victory over the kings of Northern Canaan (Josh. 11:6, 8)
- 5) Joshua took the whole land Joshua 11:23
- 6) The LORD gave them rest Joshua 21:44-45
- 7) Joshua's final words of admonition (Josh. 23:8-11)
 - *He fought for the Judges (Samson, Gideon, Jephthah)
 - *He fought for David & Jonathan (1 Sam. 14:6)
 - *He fought for Jehosaphat "The battle is the Lord's" (2 Chron. 20:15)
 - *He fought for Paul "The Lord stood with me."
 - *The last battle will be fought and won by Jesus Christ! Rev. 19:11-21; cp. Is. 63:5-6
