True Disciples
John 8:31-38
Reading: Luke 1:26-38

Bethany Baptist Church December 13, 2020 ...pray...

Let's begin by turning to John 2:23-25 and reading it *together*.

I said last Sunday that this *brief text*, appearing early in John's Gospel, is a *paradigm* for understanding faith in John.

Do you understand John's *faith principle? Not all faith is real faith* (2X; *real = saving*). Jesus knows the *difference* in each of us, from the start.

Here's another example: In **John 6** Jesus feeds a crowd and they are ready to make Him king! But when His teaching gets tough ("I am the bread of life...eat My flesh...drink My blood") they grumble and leave.

6:66 – As a result of **this** (Histeaching) many of His disciples withdrew and were not walking with Him anymore.

They grumbled and withdrew. Was their faith real? Apparently **not**...

Now let's turn to John 8:30-38.

Last Lord's Day we concluded with this *seemingly hopeful statement*, the Jews' response to Jesus' warning about *sin* and *death* and *judgment*:

v.30 - As He spoke these things many came to believe in Him.

What do you think, true or false...?

How can you know?

How do we distinguish between a true disciple and a false follower?

How about you? Are you a true disciple or a false follower? Or just dead in your sins?

Jesus explains four characteristics of a true disciple.

- 1. **Love**. Love of His *word* (31).
- 2. **Freedom**. Freedom from *sin* (32-34).
- 3. **Security**. *Eternal security* (35-36).
- 4. **Reflection.** Showing His *image* (37-38).

A disciple *loves* the word of Jesus (read v.31).

- 1. The idea of a *disciple* is popular in the **NT** gospels. What is a *disciple*?
 - a. Being a *disciple* is fundamentally an idea of *following* and *learning*.
 - b. The *Jewish Pharisees* and *rabbis* had followers. *John the Baptist* had followers. *Jesus* had followers.
 - c. Jesus raises the issue of *reality* with His most recent group of *wanna-be-followers*.
 - d. Note in **v.31**Jesus says that whether or not you are *truly* His disciples is *conditional*!
- 2. The **gate-keeper** to discipleship is *faith*. Jesus initiated this teaching with those from **v.30** who had listened to His *invitations* and *warnings*, and had *believed* in Him.
 - a. **Invitation**: v.12 "I am the Light of the World, He who follows Me will not walk in the darkness but will have the Light of life."
 - b. **Warning**: v.23, 24 "You are from below, I am from above; you are of this world, I am not of this world. Therefor I said to you that you will die in your sins."
 - c. **Condition** (hope!): v.24 "unless you believe that I am, you will die in your sins."
 - d. Apparent **outcome**: v.30 "As He spoke these things, many came to believe in Him."
 - e. *Two keywords* in John 8 are essentially synonymous: *believe & follow*.
 - i. "He who follows Me (12)...unless you believe that I am (31)"
 - f. So genuine *faith* is the **gatekeeper** to true *discipleship*.
 - i. Which begs our question and leads to Jesus' first evidence, here in v.31....
 - ii. How do you **know** your faith is *real*? **Look again at v.31**.

- 3. Jesus was saying to those Jews who had believed Him, "If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of Mine."
 - a. The *initial evidence* of *discipleship* (therefore *faith*) is your relationship to Jesus' *words*.
 - b. "**Jesus' words**" here imply what He had *just said*, what He been *saying all along*, what He has *heard* from the Father, and what *all of Scripture* (OT/NT) says.
 - i. Rom 10:17 So faith comes from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ.
- 4. Jesus could have used a *number of ideas* to *drill down* on the disciple's relationship to the word of Jesus, but He chose the world "*continue*."
 - a. If you continue in My word, then you are truly My disciples."
 - b. *Continue*. This word is *huge*! The Gr. verb is $\mu\eta\nu\omega$ *continue in* or *abide in* or *remain in*.
 - c. To *continue* means to *keep on going*. To *remain in*.
 - d. W.r.t Scripture: loving, absorbing, obeying...
 - e. **Not** just loving Jesus' words the *first day*, but *every day*.
 - i. "O how I love Your law! It is my meditation all the day"
 - ii. I can assure you, friend, all the day, implies every day.
 - f. To continue in Jesus' words means to obey Jesus' words.
 - i. Jesus: "If you love Me you will keep my commandments."
 - g. And to *continue* in Jesus' words leads to *knowing the truth*.
 - i. Jesus said, "I am the way, the **truth**, and the life, not one comes to the Father but by Me."
 - ii. If **Jesus** is *truth*, **His words** are *truth*.

- 5. Beloved, this is perhaps the easiest *time & place* in church history to put this *condition* of your *discipleship* to the test! Are you *abiding* in the Word?
 - a. Our weekly prayer list has a request that **never** gets erased: "That every BBC listener would be **equipped** by the preaching & teaching of God's Word."
 - b. So several times a week I *pray* that God will use His word to *equip* you in the faith. I *pray* for my *preaching*, for our *Sunday School teachers*, for *Bible studies*, your **QT**, your *personal study*, Christian *books*, and Christian *media*.
 - c. I know God will answer my prayer if you are His disciple!
 - d. So I'll wrap up this first characteristic with a simple comment on v.31 from John MacArthur: "True disciples are Word oriented."

Jesus' followers are free! (Read vv.32-34).

- 1. Let's begin by picking out the *key words* and discerning the Jews' *changing attitude*.
 - a. The keywords here are free (2x), enslaved, slave and sin.
 - b. The Jews are *offended* by what Jesus *implies*, and their *enthusiasm* for Jesus begins to *crumble*!
- 2. The Lord *rounded-off* His first *declaration* about *discipleship* (32.b) with this promise: "...the truth will make you free."
 - a. But if someone needs to be *freed* you must be *enslaved*.
- 3. And so the Jews were offended! Read v.33.
 - a. "We are Abraham's descendants (lit. seed)."
 - i. The Jews' *connection* to Abraham, and thus God's Covenant with the Patriarch, is their fundamental source of *spiritual identity* and *security*.
 - ii. If you belong to Abraham, all is forgiven thus all is well.
 - b. "We...have never yet been enslaved to anyone; how is it that you say, 'You will be free'?" That's the source of their irritation!
 - i. Well, *everyone* in this conversation knows *Jewish history*, and in fact, the nation had been enslaved by *Egypt, Assyria*, *Babylon, Medo-Persia, Greece, Syria*, and (now) *Rome*.
 - ii. But Jesus **wasn't** talking about *Jewish history* or *political oppression*, and these Jews *knew* it.

- c. Jesus has just reminded them of a *spiritual* truth: every woman/man *born of Adam* is man/woman *enslaved to sin*!!!
 - i. David himself lamented (Psa 51:1): Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, And in sin my mother conceived me. The king was confessing His sinful nature.
 - ii. Except...these Jews are **not** accepting it...
 - iii. "We have never yet been enslaved to anyone."
 - iv. This is a *spiritual* declaration of *spiritual* freedom, secured by being *Abraham's descendents*.
- 4. Then Jesus corrects their theology with a solemn warning (35): "<u>Truly, truly,</u> I say to you, everyone who commits sin is the slave of sin."
 - a. Sin makes slaves. Every time.
 - b. Turn w/me to Romans 6. Follow as I read vv12, 16, 19-21.
 - i. We are either slaves of sin or slaves of righteousness.
 - ii. There is **no** middle ground.
- 5. And the **only** *power* to *emancipate* you from sin is the *power* of Christ, who is the *truth*.

- 6. **That's** the **second** *truth* about Jesus' disciples: "you shall know the **truth**, and the **truth** will make you **free**." As in...free from sin!
 - a. When you *follow* Jesus and *love* His word, the daily grip of *sin* on your life will be *continually weakened* ("Progressive Sanctification").
 - b. As **Chas.Wesley** penned: **Long my imprisoned spirit lay,** fast closed in sin and nature's night. Thine eye diffused a quickening ray; I rose, the dungeon flamed with light. **My chains fell off! My heart was free!** I rose, went forth, and **followed Thee!**
 - c. Beloved, *you're free!* the follower of Jesus has **no** obligation to sin's *penalty* or *power*, and in heaven, *you'll be free of* its *presence*.
 - d. Back in **Romans 6**, Paul concludes by turning the *spiritual slave principle upside down* (22,23): But now having been *freed* from sin and *enslaved* to God, you derive your benefit, resulting in *sanctification*, and the outcome, eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord!
- 7. Beloved in the Lord, you **don't** have to sin (you are *free*!). And if you are *truly* following Jesus, ever *increasingly*, you will *walk* in your *freedom*!

Jesus' disciples are eternally secure. (Read vv.35-36).

- 1. Jesus continues with His *slave* illustration, but He resets its *meaning*.
 - a. In **vv.32-34** Jesus promised that His disciples are no longer *slaves to sin*.
 - i. It's an illustration of the *Doctrine of Total Depravity*, and Jesus' power to *free us from sin*.
 - ii. But that made the Jews mad! "We've never been slaves of sin!"
 - b. Now in **vv.35-36** Jesus teaches that *slaves* of the household are *temporary residents*. As in, His Father's *heavenly* household.
 - i. Whatever *place* (real, assumed) the Jews have in God's *household*, it's *temporary*! *Slaves* don't stay. They don't have the same status/privileges as *family*.
 - ii. But the *sons* of the household are *permanent residents*.
 - iii. Do you see it **v.35**? true sons stay forever!
 - iv. And Jesus' disciples are true sons.
- 2. If salvation makes you Jesus' *brother/sister*, your place in God's house is *secure*.
 - a. **V.35** Jesus promises: "the son (us) does remain forever."
 - b. **V.36** Jesus promises: "you will be free (sons, not servants) indeed."
 - i. The "indeed" is emphatic.

- 3. So Jesus underlines His *promise of eternal security* by emphatically repeating His *initial promise of freedom* from **v.32**.
 - a. "So if the Son makes you free, you will be free...indeed."
 - b. Freed **by** the *truth*, free from *sin*, and free to *remain forever* in the *Father's house*.
- 4. The **NT** clearly teaches that once you become Jesus' *true disciple*, you are His *forever*.
 - a. Theologians have *several labels* for this truth.
 - i. The Doctrine of Eternal Security.
 - 1. We are *secure* in Christ. Our **v.36** teaches that; we *remain/continue/abide forever*.
 - ii. The Doctrine of the **Perseverance** of the Saints.
 - 1. The <u>Pocket Dictionary of Theological Truth</u> offers def'n: ...those who are **truly** among the elect will remain faithful to the end.
 - iii. *The Doctrine of the Preservation of the Saints* (all the same truth)
 - 1. We **must & will** *persevere* to the end...because God *preserves* (always *enables*) us to *persevere* to the end.
 - 2. **Jude 24** Now to Him who is able to **keep you** from stumbling, and to **make you** stand in the presence of His glory, blameless with great joy. To Him be glory...
 - 3. He keeps you from stumbling, He makes you stand in the presence of His glory. Because you are His true sons/daughters.

Jesus followers *love* His truth, *walk* in freedom, are *kept secure*, ... and they *reflect* their Father. (Read vv.37-38)

- 1. Several years ago we went on a family vacation.
 - a. We all piled into the *elevator* to go down and start our day. An elevator *full* of nothing but **Bowens**!
 - b. On the *ground floor* the *door opened* and there was older woman waiting to *ride back up*. She stared at all of us and said,
 - c. "My! The power of genetics."
 - d. Jesus is simply saying, "you look like your father"!
- 2. Who are God's *children*?
 - a. Being *Abraham's descendant* is **no** *slam-dunk*! Jesus begins by *acknowledging* they have Abraham's **DNA**,but **not** His *righteousness*.
 - b. Back in **v.12** (began), Jesus invited anyone/everyone to *follow Me*.
 - i. **Now** (37) He accuses these Jews that instead *following* Him they want to *kill* Him.
 - c. Just a moment ago (31) Jesus said His true disciples *continue in My word*.
 - i. **Now** (37) My word had **no place** in you (lit. finds no room, makes no progress).
 - d. Does this sound like real faith...like a true disciple?

- 3. After such a *promising start* in **vv.30& 31**, why is their *faith* a *false start*?
 - a. It's a spiritual paternity problem!
 - b. Jesus' message is inspired by what He has seen with His Father.
 - i. Jesus is repeating a claim He's made often in John's Gospel.
 - 1. He has existed with the Father from all eternity.
 - 2. $(\rightarrow \text{ Jesus is } eternal. \rightarrow \text{ Jesus is } God.)$
 - 3. Jesus' works & words reflect His eternal *fellowship with the Father*.
 - 4. **5:19** (Jesus) "Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, unless it is something He sees the Father doing; for whatever the Father does, these things the Son also does in like manner. For the Father loves the Son, and shows Him all things that He Himself is doing."
 - ii. **I.e.** Jesus is uniquely God's Son...!
 - 1. So all that Jesus *does* reflects His *fellowship/relationship* with God.
 - c. As Jesus continues in **v.38**, He doesn't even allow these Jews to lay claim to **Father Abraham!**
 - i. **V.38.b** "you also do the things which you have heard from **your** father."
 - ii. They **don't** embrace Jesus' word and they **aren't** true disciples because God **isn't** their father!

- iii. Who is their father...? FF to v.44.
 - 1. Yes, *genetically*, they can pay for one of those *Ancestory* tests and trace their **DNA** to *Abraham*.
 - 2. But *spiritually*, their father is the *devil*, the ruler of *this* world system.
 - 3. Their *unrepentant pride*, their *words*, and their *deeds* all reflect the influence of their *true spiritual* father *the devil*.
 - 4. So *despite* their promising start (30), we are *back* at Jesus' earlier *warnings* (23, 24): "you are from **below** ...you are **of this world**...you will **die** in your sins."
- 4. Christian, do you know God's *purpose* for **your** life? *I do*! It's to *be like Jesus*. Which implies you'll *reflect* God.
 - a. We have a *responsibility* to be godly: **Eph 5:1** *Be imitators of God, as beloved children.*
 - b. But **God** has the *biggest* part in helping you become like Jesus. **Rom 8:29-** For those whom [God] foreknew, He also predestined to become **conformed** to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren.
 - c. ...until finally, in the Last Day (Phil 3:20), our Savior, [the Lord Jesus Christ], will transform the body of our humble estate into conformity with the body of His glory, by the exertion of the power that He has even to subject all things to Himself.
 - Did you hear that!?! From our humble estate to His body of glory! Hallelujah!

So who do you *reflect...*? Jesus reflected His Father. If you truly <u>Christ's</u> disciple, so will you.

I know there's warning/confrontation here, but this text should bring joy to Jesus' disciples!

- 1. **You love His word!** That's why you're here...
- 2. You are escaping sin's bondage! Not all once, but w/holy determination...
- 3. Your heavenly home is reserved! Jesus (Jn 14) "In My Father's house are many dwelling places. If it were not so, I would have told you, for I go to prepare a place for you. If I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself, that where I am, there you may be also."
- **4. You are** *changing*! You *love God better* than you did at the beginning. You *love your neighbor better* than you did at the beginning. **You look more like Jesus!**

"If you continue in My word, then you are **truly disciples of Mine**; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free."

...*pray*...
