II. The pedigree of King Jesus. v. 1-17

- A. God keeps His promise. v. 1
 - 1. The Deliverer (Messiah) was first promised to Adam and Eve. <u>Gen. 3:15</u> Luke 3:38 10:18 Mt. 12:29 Heb. 2:14-15 Rom. 5:14 1 Co. 15:22 45:ff
 - 2. Jesus is the Son of Abraham through Whom all nations will be blessed. Gen. 12:2-3 22:18 Gal. 3:16,6-7,29 John 8:56 Ro. 4:13,20ff
 - 3. Jesus is the Son of David Who will reign as King forever. 1:20 12:23 15:22 20:30-31 21:9,15 22:41-46 2 Sa. 7:8-16 Ro. 1:3 Ps. 89:3,29 110:1 Lu. 1:32 Rev. 22:16
- B. God keeps His promise over many years. v. 2-17
 - 1. From Adam to Abraham (about 2000 BC). Luke 3:34-38
 - 2. Fourteen generations from Abraham to David (about 1000 BC). v. 2-6a
 - 3. Fourteen generations from David to the exile (about 600 BC). v. 6b-11
 - 4. Fourteen generations from the exile to the birth of Christ. v. 12-16 Isa. 11:1ff
- C. God keeps His promise in spite of human sin.
 - 1. The record of Jesus' ancestors is a record of spiritual failure.
 - 2. Abraham disobediently sought to produce an heir through the flesh and nearly gave away his wife to pagan kings. Gen. 16:1ff 12:11ff 20:1ff
 - 3. Jacob was a deceiver. Gen. 27
 - 4. Judah produced his heir in a particularly shameful and sordid way. v. 3 Gen. 38:1ff 49:10
 - 5. David bore his successor, Solomon, by stealing another man's wife. v. 6b 2 Sa. 11
 - 6. After David, things went from bad to worse, culminating in exile. 1-2 Kings
 - 7. Why would Matthew choose people like this to explain who Jesus is?
- D. What is the significance of the women included in Matthew's genealogy of Jesus?
 - 1. Ruth the Moabitess and Rahab the Canaanite show the breadth of God's grace beyond Abraham's physical offspring. Ruth 1:4 Josh. 2:9ff Deut. 23:3 Gen. 12:3 John 3:16 4:42 Luke 2:10
 - 2. Bathsheba, Tamar and Rahab also remind us of God's great grace to sinners.
- E. Why does Matthew give us Joseph's genealogy since Joseph is not the biological father? v. 16
 - 1. Matthew makes it clear in the next section that Jesus is not born of Joseph. v. 18ff
 - 2. Joseph is chosen to be the adoptive father of Jesus.
 - 3. Through Joseph, Jesus has legal claim to the throne of Israel.
- F. Application.
 - 1. Marvel at the condescension of the Son of God. Phil. 2:5ff John 1:1-4,14
 - 2. God still keeps his promises! 2 Pet. 3:3ff Acts 1:11 1 Th. 4:13ff
 - 3. Human sin cannot thwart God's purposes. Ro. 8:28 Gen. 50:20 Acts 2:23
 - 4. Even the best of men and women need God's grace. Gal. 2:16 Ro. 3:10ff
 - 5. Even the worst of men and women are not outside of the reach of God's grace. 1 Tim. 1:15-16
 - 6. Thanks be to God that we who were far off have been brought near! Eph. 2:11ff
 - 7. Grace does not always run in families. Ezek. 18:1ff Luke 12:52-53 Prov. 1:8ff

III. Joseph proves himself to be a true son of David. v. 18-25

- A. God, in His wisdom, chose Joseph to be Jesus' adoptive earthly father. v. 18-19a
- B. Joseph is a righteous man. v. 18-20a
 - 1. Joseph faces a great crisis with his fiancee' Mary. v. 18b
 - 2. Joseph is a merciful man. v. 19 Gen. 38:24 Dt. 22:23-24 42:1ff Mt. 5:32 19:3ff John 8:1-11
 - 3. Application: How do you react when others hurt and wrong you? Eph. 4:31-32 Rom. 12:17-21 Mt. 18:21ff
 - 4. Joseph is also a careful man. v. 20a Js. 1:19-20 Pr. 19:2 29:20
 - 5. Application: Things are not always what they appear to be.
- C. Joseph is also a believing man. v. 20,24-25
 - 1. He receives the word from the angel without question. v. 20 Luke 1:18,34
 - 2. Joseph obeys God's angel. v. 24-25
 - a. He takes Mary as his legal wife. v. 24
 - b. He foregoes his marital privileges until after Jesus is born. v. 25a 12:46-47
 - c. He protects and provides for Mary and Jesus. 2:13-15,19-21
 - 3. Joseph gives a powerful testimony to the virgin conception and birth.
 - 4. Application: Joseph is like the silent servants among us.

IV. Jesus is the true Son of David (and Abraham). v. 20-23

- A. He is the Son of God born of a virgin. v. 20b,23a Isa. 7:14 Luke 1:30-35 Ga. 4:4
 - 1. The conception of Jesus was miraculous.
 - 2. Why does the virgin birth matter? Heb. 4:15 2 Co. 5:21 Ro. 5:12
- B. He is Immanuel God with us. v. 22-23 Isa. 7:14
 - 1. He is fully God. John 1:1ff 8:58 20:28 Isa. 9:6 Ro. 9:5 1 Ti. 3:16
 - 2. He is truly and fully human. John 1:14 Heb. 2:14ff Ro. 8:3
 - 3. God dwells with His people. John 1:14-18 Mt. 28:20 Rev. 21:23 Isa. 60:18ff
- C. He is Jesus, the Savior of His people. v. 21 18:11 John 3:16-17 Ps. 130:8 Isa. 53
 - 1. He was not the revolutionary political leader the Jews sought. John 1:11
 - 2. People today still misunderstand Jesus' mission He was not merely a teacher of morality and religion.
 - 3. He came to save His people from their sin. Luke 1:47,69 John 1:29 Mark 10:45 1 Pet. 1:18-19 3:18 2 Co. 5:21 Isa. 53:4-6,10-12
- D. Jesus is incomparable! 1 Tim. 2:5 Rev. 5:9-10
