## The Wisdom of Men

2 Samuel 16:1-17:29

- I. Ziba (16:1-4)
- II. Shimei (16:5-14)
  - A. Curses and symbolically executes David with stones.
  - B. David's response (11b-12): this is what humility looks like.
- III. Hushai comes into Absalom's presence (16:15-19)
  - A. An ambiguous statement of loyalty!
  - B. We don't yet know whether Hushai is on David's side.
- IV. Ahithophel's first advice (16:20-21)
- V. Absalom and David's concubines (16:22-23)
  - A. Absalom follows his counsel, in a tent on the palace rooftop (see 2 Samuel 12:11-12).
- VI. Ahithophel's second advice (17:1-4)
  - A. Let Ahithophel gather a force of 12,000 and attack David a.s.a.p.
  - B. At the moment, David and his small group are very vulnerable.
- VII. Hushai's "better" idea (17:5-14): gather "all Israel"
- VIII. Jonathan and Ahimaaz (17:15-20): spies (see Joshua 2)
- IX. Setting the stage (17:23-29)
  - A. Ahithophel's fate (see 2 Samuel 15:31)
  - B. Amasa the general
  - C. Unexpected help on the far side of the Jordan River
- X. "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom."
  - A. Wordly wisdom: Identify what you want, and use your brain to get it.
  - B. Be suspicious of your own wisdom.
  - C. Divine wisdom: Do what God requires of you, even if you cannot see how it will work out. (see 15:31; Job 28:28; Psalm 111:10; Proverbs 1:7; 9:10; 15:33; Isaiah 11:2; James 3:13-18; John 11:49-50; 1 Corinthians 1:20-21)
  - D. God has displayed his wisdom.
