READ tonight's passages: Matthew 1:1-17. DISCUSS, How does what we do demonstrate what we truly believe? How can we help one another? PRAISE God for His faithfulness.

#### **Monday-Saturday**

1. READ Candle Lighting litany—The Angels' Candle

#### Leader: Why do we light the Advent candles?

- Family: Jesus said, "I am the Light of the world. He who follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the Light of Life."
- Leader: What is the meaning of the second lighted candle?
- Family: The second lighted candle represents the angels proclaiming Christ's birth.
- Leader: Who were the angels?
- Family: The angels were created by God to fill the heavenly court with the praise of His name. They devote themselves to serving God in heaven by delighting to do His will. God also uses them as messengers of His Good News to men and women on earth.

#### Leader: What do the Gospels say about the angels?

- *Family:* Luke writes, "Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests.""
- 2. LIGHT the first two Advent Candles.
- 3. READ aloud Luke 1:26-38.
- 4. SING Hark the Herald Angels Sing.

1. Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King; Peace on earth and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled." Joyful, all ye nations, rise, Join the triumph of the skies; With angelic hosts proclaim, "Christ is born in Bethlehem." Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King."

2. Christ, by highest heav'n adored, Christ, the everlasting Lord; Late in time behold Him come, Offspring of the virgin's womb. Veiled in flesh the Godhead see, Hail, the incarnate Deity! Pleased as man with men to dwell. Jesus our Emmanuel. Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King."

Hail the Sun of righteousness! Light and life to all He brings, Ris'n with healing in His wings. Mild He lays His glory by,

3. Hail the heav'n born Prince of Peace! Born that man no more may die; Born to raise the sons of earth, Born to give them second birth. Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King!"

Forgive us for making careers, relationships and other things the rulers of our affections. Set us free from our fears and sins that you may be the true desire of our longing hears.
