Nehemiah: A governor who truly served the needs of his people

1. His Kindnesses Recounted	vv. 14-18
(1) He did not live off of his brethren! (14-15)	"from the time that I was appointed to be their governor twelve yearsneither I nor my brothers ate the governor's provisions."
-1- Note the abuse of privilege, the excesses of the previous governors	
Excessive taxationSinful abuses of authority	
 -2- He could have justly claimed some measure of provision, but did not! - Did not want to add to the burdens of God's people. 	
- Lived from his own resources for the whole 12-year period.	
(2) He did not seek personal enricl - He did not buy land or propertie	hment "Indeed, I also continued the work on this wall, and we did not buy any land. All my servants were gathered there for the work."
- He did not use his position or authority to amass personal wealth	
(3) All of his resources were utilized in the vital project of rebuilding — directed toward the interests of the people of God	
(4) He provided generously for a l -1- Daily provision!	large contingent of Jews and Rulers (17-18)
-2- Generous provision!	
-3- All from his own resources!	

2. His Kindnesses Remembered

v. 19

- (1) His plea that he and his many kindnesses might be accepted of God
 - A plea for God's favor

"Remember me, my God, for good, according to all that I have done for this people."

- (2) The Divine testimony of such acceptance
 - His deeds forever recorded here!
