



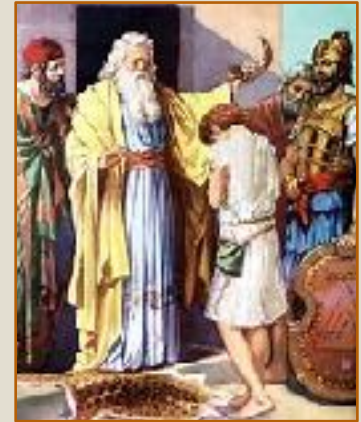

The Man David

- God chose David because of his **heart** for God.
- David's **strength** could also be his **weakness**.
- David's life was a unique mix of diverse **talents** and **experiences**.
- David was a product of his **family** dynamics.

Samuel Anoints David

*We cannot help but be impressed with David's obedience and humility. As the "baby of the family" he had very **little status**, but he was **faithful** to his father and to the Lord. David's life illustrates Matt 25:21 — he began as a **servant** and became a **ruler**; he was faithful with a **few sheep** and then inherited the **whole nation**; he knew how to **work**, so God gave him **joy**.*

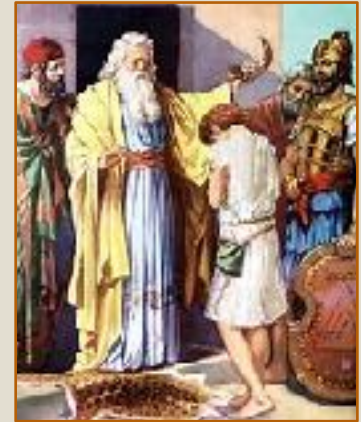
