### The Good News Turns Grief into Joy

John 16:16-24 (page 86 in the black Bibles) From: Don White January 22, 2023

#### The Main Point:

The Good News of Jesus' death and resurrection has the power to transform a believer's grief into a secure joy which fills his/her life.

### Transition Statement (v. 16)

<sup>16</sup>"<u>A little while</u>, and you will no longer see Me; and again <u>a little while</u>, and you will see Me."

The phrase, "a little while," is used 7 times in verses 16-19.

John 7:33; 14:19

A little while and you will not see Me – Jesus' death and burial.

A little while and you will see me – Jesus' resurrection.

#### The Disciples Confusion (vv. 17-19)

<sup>17</sup>Some of His disciples then said to one another, "What is this thing He is telling us,

'<u>A little while</u>, and you will not see Me; and again <u>a little while</u>, and you will see Me';

and, 'because I go to the Father'?"

John 14:28; 16:5, 10

<sup>18</sup>So they were saying, "What is this that He says, '<u>A little while</u>'?

We do not know what He is talking about."

#### Jesus Acknowledges the Disciples' Confusion (v. 19)

<sup>19</sup>Jesus knew that they wished to **question** Him, and He said to them, "Are you deliberating together about this, that I said,

#### '<u>A little while</u>, and you will not see Me, and again <u>a little while</u>, and you will see Me'?

See v. 23 "In that day you will not **question** Me about anything." John 16:29-30 <u>Two Responses to Jesus' Death</u> (v. 20)

20"Truly, truly, I say to you, that

you will weep and lament,

The kind of weeping and lamenting associated with the death of a loved one. See John 11:31, 33; Luke 23:27

but the world will rejoice;

"the world" – the religious leaders, people who are alienated from God and at enmity with God because of their sins.

John 1:10; 3:16-19; 12:31; 14:17, 19, 15:18-24; also James 4:4

"will rejoice" - they will be glad.

1 Corinthians 1:18-24

2 Corinthians 2:14-16

# The Good News Transforms Grief into Joy (v. 20)

Reversal --

you will grieve, but your grief will be turned into joy.

John 16:6; 20:20

Unless they believe and repent the world's rejoicing will be turned to weeping.

Luke 13:22-28

# <u>Illustration</u>: A Woman's Anguish in Labor Turned to Joy (v. 21)

<sup>21</sup>"Whenever a woman is in labor she has pain, because her hour has come; but when she gives birth to the child, she no longer remembers the anguish because of the joy that a child has been born into the world.

# The Good News Ensures that Your Joy Will Endure (v. 22)

<sup>22</sup> Therefore you too have grief <u>**now**</u>; but I will see you again, and your heart will rejoice, and no one will take your joy away from you.

Acts 5:40-42

# The Good News, Answered Prayer & Joy Made Full (vv. 23-24)

<sup>23</sup>"In that day you will not question Me about anything.

John 14:20; 16:26

Truly, truly, I say to you, if you ask the Father for anything in My name, He will give it to you.

24 "Until now you have asked for nothing in My name;

ask and you will receive,

so that your joy may be made full.
