Matthew 1:18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was

on this wise: When as his mother Mary was espoused to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Ghost. 19 Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not willing to make her a publick example, was minded to put her away privily. 20 But while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost. 21 And she shall bring forth a son, and thou

shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins. 22 Now all

the angel of the Lord had bidden him, and took unto him his wife: 25 And knew her not till she had brought forth her firstborn son: and he called his name JESUS.

- He was rich and became poor for our sakes
 II Corinthians 8:9 For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus
 Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes
 he became poor, that ye through his
 poverty might be rich.
 - a. Jesus Christ lived before He arrived on earth for what we call Christmas
 - b. He lived in the very presence of God
 - c. He was and is God
 - d. At Christmas we celebrate His intentionally giving up His riches to become poor and come to earth
 - e. He became poor so that we could be rich and live forever abundantly
- 2. He laid down His kingly robes and put on human flesh and became obedient even to the death of the cross

Philippians 2:6 Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: 7 But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: 8 And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

- a. Jesus Christ is God
- b. He was in Heaven equal with God
- c. He gives up His reputation and intentionally takes the form of a servant
- d. He takes the form of a man
- e. Humbling Himself to the point of dying the most horrendous death on the cross

- 3. He came to give His life a ransom Matthew 20:28 Even as the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many.
 - a. He came to give His life

 - c. He came to pay the price of our salvation
 - d. He rescued us paying the price of our salvation
- 4. He came to take the penalty of sin for us I John 2:2 And he is the propitiation for our sins: and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world.
 - a. He brings peace on earth and good will for men
 - b. He not only paid our sin debt but that of the whole world
 - c. Propitiation is similar to the word mercy seat on the altar
 - d. It sat above the ark, the 10 commandments, and was the place that God would meet with His people

5. He came to lay down His life John 10:18 No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This

commandment have I received of my Father.

- a. Jesus died on purpose
- b. No one took His life
