To seek and to find those who are not looking for Him.

v43

"He found Philip"

Romans 10:20

"Follow me" present tense, i.e., 'keep on following'; active imperative.

A disciple's call to *follow* is for life.

"Bethsaida"

"Nathanael"

"Jesus of Nazareth"

"son of Joseph"

v46

Nathanael was being candid.

"Come and see"

"If you seek him, he will be found by you" 1 Chronicles 28:9

v47

"indeed" Gk *alethos*; 'truly, in truth, really'

"deceit" Gk *dolos*; 'craft, guile, cunning, treachery.'

v48

Nathanael understood immediately that Jesus knew private, personal things about him.

Jesus Himself is the direct line of communication between heaven and earth for those who believe.

"you will see heaven opened" Gk perfect tense

"What are you seeking?" v38 – examine your hearts; ***"Come and you will see."*** v39, v46

Notice the connection between faith and sight.

Seeking is finding. Believing is seeing. Seeing is knowing. Knowing is loving. Loving is following.
