B. Jesus is Lord. "Lord" means King. (vs 10-11)

Everyone will call Jesus "Lord". You can do it now and enjoy it in heaven forever, or you can do it later and regret it in hell forever. Is Jesus your Lord?

"But why do you call Me 'Lord, Lord,' and not do the things which I say?" Luke 6:46

Humble yourself and establish Jesus as the King of your life by doing two things:

1. Salvation ~ Experience His Love

"that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."

2. Surrender ~ Experience His Joy

Jesus Is The Lord

I. THE CRIB OF JESUS THE LORD (2:5-7)

A. Jesus came to earth. (vs 5-6)

He was God in the flesh.

"I and My Father are one."

John 10:30

"And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth." John 1:14

B. Jesus became a man (v 7)

How was Jesus like us?

1. He was born like us.

"6 So it was, that while they were there, the days were completed for her to be delivered.

7 And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."

Luke 2:6-7

2. He grew like us.

"And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men." Luke 2:52

3. He was tempted like us.

"For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin." Heb.4:15

4. He suffered like us.

"Then He said to them, "My soul is exceedingly sorrowful, even to death. Stay here and watch with Me."

II. THE CROSS OF JESUS THE LORD (2:8)

Jesus came to die (v 8b). Why did He do it?

A. To demonstrate God's love.

"In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him." I John 4:9

B. To pay for my sins.

"For Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive by the Spirit," I Peter 3:18

III. THE CROWN OF JESUS THE LORD (2:9-11)

A. Jesus is exalted. (v 9)

"For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted." Luke 14:11

"And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence." Colossians 1:18
