>	"Is a deep, durable delight in God that can't be extinguished by anything else" (Piper).
The Story	
>	Herod: the psychotically king. Isaiah 60:3, "Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising."
>	The wise men: court magicians, astronomers, or princes from the Numbers 24:17, "A star will come out of Jacob, and a scepter shall rise out of Israel.
>	The point: God is leading these wise men to Bethlehem to the One who is born King of the Jews. Matthew 2:6 (quoting Micah 5:2), "And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel."
>	The religious establishment knows the Old Testament promises about Jesus and the signs that point to Jesus, but they are to Jesus.
>	Herod will protect his position at all costs—he pretends, but intends,
>	It isn't luck or fate that brings the wise men to Jesus; it's If you are a believer in Jesus, then God has done the same with you. In sovereign grace, He has opened your eyes to Jesus and brought you to Him.
