 - i. Covenant Faithfulness to Abraham (Exo 1:7, 12; 2:23-25; 6:5)
 - ii. God Establishes His Covenant through Moses (20:1-17; 24:1-11; 34:10)
 - b. Revelation: the Lord Reveals Himself to His People
 - i. Theophany: The Lord Appears (3:2; 13:21-22; 14:19-20; 19:16-20; 34:5-8; 40:34-38)
 - ii. Theology: The Lord Speaks (3:14; 20:1-19; 34:5-8)
 - c. Redemption: the Lord Redeems His People from Slavery in Egypt to Become Servants of the Lord
 - i. Demonstrates the Lord's Sovereign Power (4:23)
 - ii. Demonstrates the Lord's Faithfulness (Exo 3:12)
 - iii. The Lord Redeems for Himself a People (12-13; 19:4-6)
- 2. The Climactic Conclusion that Unites the Themes: God's Glorious Presence with His People
 - a. The Lord's Glory Fills the Tabernacle (40:34-38)
 - b. The Lord's Glorious Presence in Jesus Christ (John 1:14; 28:20; Acts 2; 1 Cor 3:16; Heb 11:13-16; Rev 21-22)
