Pastor: What is your only comfort in life and in death?

¹ Catechisms are a question and answer format used for teaching in the church. The Heidelberg Catechism was written in 1563 and approved by the Church at the Synod of Dort (1618-1619).

Congregation: That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—to my faithful Savior Jesus Christ.

He has fully paid for all my sins with His precious blood, and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven: in fact, all things must work together for my salvation.

Because I belong to Him, Christ, by His Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for Him.

Pastor: What must you know to live and die in the joy of this

comfort?

Congregation: Three things: first, how great my sin and misery are; second, how I am set free from all my sins and misery; third, how I am to thank God for such

deliverance.

Psalm 34:18-22 ESV

The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit.

Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the Lord delivers him out of them all. He keeps all his bones; not one of them is broken. Affliction will slay the wicked, and those who hate the righteous will be condemned. The Lord redeems the life of his servants: none of those who take refuge in him will be condemned.

The Celebration of Christmas—December 25-January 6

The season of Christmas starts Christmas morning and runs through the Feast of the Epiphany (January 6th) that is the traditional celebration of the wise men coming to worship Christ as King. Whereas Advent's emphasis is *longing for Christ's next coming* and fasting over our sin, traditionally the focus through the twelve days of Christmas and Epiphany is on celebration and feasting since Christ has come.

PRAY: "Lord Jesus, thank You for coming to rescue us from sin and death."

FEAST: Enjoy a special meal as a birthday celebration with Jesus!

The **Second** Day of CHRISTMAS **Monday—December 26**

READ: Isaiah 7:14; 9:6-7.

DISCUSS: What does Immanuel mean? How has Jesus fulfilled His promise?

SING: *Joy to the World! The Lord Is Come*

PRAY: Tell Jesus why He is worthy of your worship. Thank Him. Ask Him

to guide you in worshipping Him each day.

The **Third** Day of CHRISTMAS **Tuesday—December 27**

READ: Isaiah 7:14; 9:6-7; Psalm 34:18-22; Matthew 1:18-25.

DISCUSS: How can we encourage one another to trust Christ in our daily lives?

SING: Joy to the World

PRAY: "Lord, thank You for allowing Isaiah to help us long for Your return."

The Fourth Day of CHRISTMAS Wednesday— December 28

READ: Isaiah 60:1-7; Matthew 2:13-23.

DISCUSS: Why did Jesus and His family have to flee to Egypt? How does this

mirror the journey of Israel? How does God use tragic things in life?

SING: What Child Is This?

PRAY: "Jesus, thank You for being a refugee so that we could be brought

home. Thank You for humbling Yourself as a servant to love us."

The **Fifth** Day of CHRISTMAS **Thursday—December 29**

READ: Isaiah 7:14; 9:6-7; Matthew 3:1-17.

DISCUSS: What does it mean for the Father to be pleased with Jesus? How does

that affect His response to us who are in Christ? Rejoice!

SING: *Joy to the World*

PRAY: "Lord Christ, You have revealed the glory of God to us. We see Your

holiness in Your perfect obedience for us. Please cause Your radiance to shine within us, to change us, enliven us, and to shine to others.

The **Sixth** Day of CHRISTMAS **Friday—December 30**

READ: Isaiah 7:14; 9:6-7; Matthew 4:1-25.

DISCUSS: Why did Jesus come to earth? What was the point of His temptation?

SING: What Child Is This?

PRAY: "Lord, thank You for being faithful where we have failed."

The **Seventh** Day of CHRISTMAS **Saturday—December 31**

READ: Isaiah 7:14; 9:6-7; Matthew 5:1-20.

DISCUSS: How did Jesus explain the law? How are we to keep it? Why?

SING: God Rest You Merry, Gentlemen

PRAY: "Jesus, thank You for doing what we could not. Help us now to do

what You have freed us to do in love. Enable us to walk in Your

Spirit."
