 - **A. Authority:** "Say it, teacher" (v.40)
 - **B. Analysis:** "Which...will love him more?" (vv.41-42)
 - **C. Approval:** "the one whom He forgave more" (v.43)
- III. PARDON: "sins have been forgiven" (vv.44-50)
 - **A. Distinction:** "Do you see this woman?" (vv.44-47)
 - 1. Guest: "no water...wet My feet with her tears" (v.44)
 - 2. Greeting: "no kiss...has not ceased to kiss My feet" (v.45)
 - 3. Grooming: "did not anoint...she anointed My feet" (v.46)
 - 4. Gratitude: "forgiven, for she loved much" (v.47)
 - **B. Division:** "sins/forgiven...faith has saved you" (vv.48-50)
 - 1. Fact: "Your sins have been forgiven" (v.48)
 - 2. Fools: "Who is this man...forgives sins?" (v.49)
 - 3. Faith: "Your faith has saved you" (v.50)
