 - A. Definition "A created, spiritual being with moral judgment and high intelligence, but without a physical body." Wayne Grudem
 - B. Purposes in Scripture
 - 1. Messengers (Genesis 16:9-11; Genesis 19; Genesis 22)
 - a. Prophecy
 - b. Announcement
 - c. Judgment
 - 2. Warriors (Numbers 22:22)
 - 3. Ministering spirits (Genesis 24:7)
 - 4. Worship (Isaiah 6)
 - C. There appears to be a "divine" aspect to most appearances of the "angel of the LORD"
- II. Angels in Relationship To Jesus
 - A. Angelic interaction with the first and second advent
 - 1. Angels announced Jesus' birth (Matthew 1:20)
 - 2. Angels announced Jesus' name (Matthew 1:21)
 - 3. Angels announced Jesus' family's need to flee to Egypt (Matthew 2:13)
 - 4. Angels ministered to Jesus in the wilderness (Matthew 4:11)
 - 5. Angels could have been called down to wage war during crucifixion (Matthew 26:53)

- 6. Angels announced Jesus' resurrection (Matthew 28:1-7)
- 7. Angels aid in the eschaton (Matthew 24:31)
- B. Yet, Jesus is greater than the angels (Hebrews 1-2)
- C. As such: Jesus' Incarnation also elevates humanity above the realm of angels
 - 1. Jesus was made like us, in our flesh, to take our sin, to die our death, to give us life
 - 2. Even the angel announced "You shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." Matthew 1:21
