Stephen

Acts: 6:8-7:60 Acts: The Real Church Pastor Phil Winfield January 24, 2016

There are at least two major messages in this passage.

- The Jews had elevated Jerusalem and its' temple to **idol status**.
- The Jews always rejected **<u>God's messengers</u>**.

Markers of rejection:

- 1. Like Jesus, Stephen was **falsely accused** 6:8-16 What were the accusations against him?
 - a. He blasphemes our **holy place**, the Temple v.13.
 - b. He blasphemes our <u>holy prophet</u> Moses and the law and God himself. V.11,13.
 - *c.* He calls for the <u>destruction</u> of our Temple and <u>changing our customs</u> v.14.
- 2. Like Jesus, Stephen was **<u>mighty</u>** in the scriptures 7:1-50
 - a. They **misunderstood** Abraham their Father (7:2-8).
 - b. They rejected God's servant **Joseph** (9-16).
 - c. They rejected God's servant Moses (17-43).
 - d. They worshipped the house of God not the **<u>God of the house</u>** (v.44-50)
- 3. Like Jesus Stephen's words brought deep **<u>conviction</u>** 7:51-54.
- 4. Like Jesus, Stephen was **<u>exalted</u>** in his death 7:54-60.
 - a. He looked to Jesus
 - b. He believed in forgiveness
 - c. He fell asleep.

Make a decision:

- Our message of salvation is so important that it requires us to take **<u>a stand</u>**.
- Our message of salvation will be often rejected sometimes **viciously**.
- Our message of salvation must be clear. You can't substitute a religious tradition for a **relationship** with the Father through his Son Jesus.
- Our witness of God's grace and salvation will always be accompanied by Holy Spirit's presence and it will be <u>noticed</u> in heaven (v.55).
