> > The Testimony of Faith

"The LORD gave, and the LORD hath taken away: blessed be the name of the LORD." (Job 1:21)

Il of the LORD's elect, whether in the Old Testament or since the cross, have the same testimony of Faith because the same Spirit Who grants that Faith works effectually in each one, <u>Ephesians 4:5-8</u>. The entire chapter 11 of Hebrews is the testimony of Faith given of all of the LORD's elect beginning with Abel, to Enoch, Abraham, Moses, Lot, etc., they were chosen vessels of Mercy by God and He separated them out to Himself and appointed them as sinners for whom the LORD Jesus would pay their sin debt. The Faith they share is having been chosen in Christ before the foundation of the world, redeemed and justified by His shed blood unto death and being called to Christ by His Spirit, <u>Ephesians 1:3-7</u>.

It was not because they were any better than any others. Even though Job, by God's mercies was upright in his generation, he still had to learn that any righteousness before God must be that which God would grant him through the work of the LORD Jesus alone. While he thought he knew God, the LORD would teach him Truth and bring him to repentance. In the end he declared: "I have heard of thee by the hearing of the ear: but now mine eye seeth thee. Wherefore I abhor myself, and repent in dust and ashes." (Job 42:5-6) True repentance is a continual turning to God, even faith in the LORD Jesus, Acts 20:21.

When the LORD began His work of humbling Job, there wasn't an ounce of wrath in His dealings with him, as harsh as the circumstances were in stripping him of every earthly prop. God purposed it all in Mercy because he was a vessel of Mercy and all vessels of Mercy the LORD will humble and bring them to confess even as he initially did, 'THE LORD gave and the LORD hath taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD.' The name of the LORD is the LORD Jesus Christ: "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." (Acts 4:12)

There are those from whom God in His sovereign will has taken away the Light of the Gospel and judicially blinded them, that they never even desire to seek Him through His Son the LORD Jesus alone without any contribution of man's will or works, <u>2 Corinthians 4:4</u>. However, there are others, like Job and all of God's elect that He has given to Christ and given them salvation, sanctification, justification and eternal [endless] life by Christ's perfect obedience unto death. What He has given can never be taken away, <u>John 10:28</u>. In every case, whether withholding Grace or giving it, 'blessed be the name of the LORD.' The LORD alone gets the glory.

Those that are the LORD's have but this one testimony of Faith. While Job suffered the loss of all temporals and even false spiritual hope, by the Spirit of Grace, he declared: "*My Redeemer liveth!*" (Job 19:25) In Him, by Him and through Him, all is well! [Romans 11:36]

### What is the Gospel?

he Gospel declares all that God has done to deliver His chosen people from imputed damnation and their native darkness. The Gospel concerns the elect looking to their Substitute on the cross where God delivered them from the law's penalties and where God discharged sin and imputed righteousness.

The Gospel reveals how God delivered His elect from the darkness of disbelieving and misbelieving. By sovereign Spiritual awakening, the Spirit of God enters the soul and enlightens the elect regarding what He has done for them in the LORD Jesus. With the mind illuminated and the affections fired, the will obeys and follows God's sovereign call of Grace. They turn from false notions of God to the Way of Light. The Gospel affirms God's unconditional election of sinners before the foundation of the world, justification by Christ at the cross and the Holy Spirit awakening them in time. This is not alternate doctrine or higher doctrine; it is the only Doctrine. And this Gospel must be heard: Eph. 1:13; understood: Rom. 15:20-21 and believed: Rom. 10:14-16.

#### A Settled Matter

ntil it is a settled matter in the mind of an individual as to WHEN the imputation of righteousness occurred, confusion will reign. There was only one imputation of righteousness. It exclusively occurred at the cross of the LORD Jesus Christ. It was strictly a judicial act. The result was God declaring all the elect of all time, righteous in His sight: Rom. 4:25; Rom. 5:1. God ratified this one-time declaration of righteousness by raising Christ from the dead. The resurrection of Christ was the objective proof positive, to the elect, of the finished justification of all those in Christ. Until Christ came, God did forbear with and did pass-over the sins of all the Old Testament saints, including Abraham: Rom. 3:25. For without the shedding of blood there is no remission. Likewise, His attribute of forbearance also granted a reckoning of the Faith by Promise, in which 'Faith' was the objective contents of Faith meaning Christ Himself and His future coming to bring in that everlasting righteousness that God would at long last impute to the elect upon the establishment of it: Rom. 4:3-13; Gal. 3:18. Like Abraham, all Old Testament saints believed the promise of that one true righteousness TO BE established by the LORD Jesus Christ on their behalf: John 8:56. New Testament saints look back to that one time declared righteousness. What God did by PROMISE for OT saints was actually accomplished and declared to be so upon the death of Christ: Rom. 4:25. This is precisely what the resurrection signified: righteousness imputed and sin not imputed resulting in finished justification at the cross of Christ.
