The Ruling Peace of Christ Colossians 3:15 Pastor Conley

Review:

There are many circumstances in life that give us reason to fear and worry. In spite of these difficulties God is calling us to live lives that are "ruled" by the peace that His Son brings. This kind of peace can "keep us" in the most difficult circumstances. In fact, the Scripture says that this peace is so amazing that it "passes our understanding" (sometimes it doesn't even make sense to us). This peace leads us into a peace with others. "If God can get along with me, then I can get along with others." Because of these things we are to "Keep on becoming thankful."
