Divine Marching Orders for those Passing through the Valley of the Shadow of Death, Pt. 1 Zephaniah 2:1-3

January 26, 2014

I. Introduction

The church has and will continue to suffer alongside the wicked in this world! Genuine servants of the Lord, who had not bowed the knee to Baal, suffered along with God's people at this time! God did not *rapture* them out of the trial. Yet they were not abandoned by the Lord!

Zeph. 2:1

II. Divine Marching Orders for those Passing through the Valley of the Shadow of Death, Zeph. 2:1-3.

- A. The Call (Zeph. 2:3a): Passionately and fervently to seek...
 - 1. A Person

To seek the Lord is to seek His Person and so to love Him, know Him, commune with Him, and so fellowship with Him in and through all things.

...in trial we must see that our highest calling is to seek the Lord! For, in the words of Jeremiah, "...you will find *Me*, when you search for Me with all your heart" (Jer. 29:13)!

In explanation as to what this specifically means in Scripture, we go to Scripture. When we do that we note that to "seek the Lord" in the Bible denotes at least five things: To Seek the Lord is...

a. To Seek to Know His Forgiveness, Is. 55:6-7; Acts 15:14-19.

To seek the Lord is to forsake all human coping mechanisms. It is to live on this earth knowing the satisfaction that though the world has forsaken you, the Lord has not! He is your only comfort, support, and friend! So be content so long as you have Him as your Lord, Savior, and Companion!

b. To Seek to Rely Upon Him, 2 Chron. 16:12; Is. 31:1.

Clearly another facet of "seeking the Lord" is relying/depending upon the Lord in and through all things...

Such is the calling that is given to all God's children living in this state of sin and misery. Indeed we are to work, labor, and toil... but it is all to be done in reliance upon Christ. In this context, recognize an important diagnostic tool...

c. To Seek to Pray, Dan. 9:3.

It is should be clear from this text that "seeking the Lord" is synonymous with "prayer and supplications, with fasting, sackcloth, and ashes"- all of which denote a humble reliance upon God via prayer!

You say, "Isn't this the same as the last point, 'Relying upon God?'" Yes and no! Prayer does speak of a God-ward look of dependence and devotion- the focus of Point 2. However, the emphasis here is on actually praying to God!

d. To Seek to Live Vicariously through His Person, 1 Chron. 16:7a-11.

This passage equates "glorying in God's holy character," "making known God's deeds among the peoples," and "speaking of all His wonders" WITH "seeking Him."

e. To Seek to Worship Him on His Terms, Deut. 12:5; Ps. 22:26.

A fifth and final synonym when it comes to seeking the Lord is worshipping Him- NOT as the Canaanites did, BUT according to His word! That is the contrast!

A Key Component to Canaanite Religion

In reference to this religion, Moses said, "You shall not act like this toward the Lord your God" (Deut. 12:4)!
