The Vision of the Holy God

I. The Holy God

A. Isaiah sees the Lord sitting on a throne, in the temple, in His glory.

B. These angels are around the throne calling to each other, "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord of hosts: the whole earth is full of His glory." These words reveal the glory of God.

II. The Necessary Knowledge

A. God is saying to Isaiah that what he needed more than anything else at that moment was to see the Lord sitting on the throne in His holiness. God is teaching Isaiah to fear Him.

B. God is saying to us that what we need more than anything else is to see the glory of God.

III. The Powerful Movement
