I. Jesus' Far-reaching Concern (v. 35)

1 After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of Him, two by two, into every town and place where He Himself was about to go. II. Jesus' Genuine Compassion (v. 36)

2 Thessalonians 3:1 (ESV) 1 Finally, brothers, pray for us, that the Word of the Lord may speed ahead and be honored, as happened among you,

4 Carry no moneybag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road.

3. We must place a high priority on praying to God to enable us to see the fields ready to be harvested, to send out laborers into the field, and be willing to be the answer to our own prayers.
