Leader: Come, let us light the first Advent Candle!

- Family: We can't wait to see Jesus who is coming back for us!
- Leader: How do candles point us to Jesus who is *the Light of the World*?
- Family: Jesus said, "I am the Light of the world. He who follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the Light of Life." (John 8:12)
- Leader: What is the promise God has given to His people?
- **Family:** The promise was first given by God that a child born of the woman would *deliver us from sin and death*.
- Leader: Who is this promised Deliverer?
- **Family:** Our Deliverer, Jesus, who is Messiah, the anointed One, came just as He promised. (John 4:25-26)
- Leader: What else did Messiah promise?
- **Family:** Jesus promised that He will return for us and save all who trust in Him as true Messiah. (John 14:1-7)
- Leader: Hebrews 6:13-20

For when *God made a promise to Abraham*, since he had no one greater by whom to swear, he swore by himself, saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you." And thus Abraham, having patiently waited, obtained the promise. For people swear by something greater than themselves, and in all their disputes an oath is final for confirmation. *So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he guaranteed it with an oath*, so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us. *We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul*, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest forever after the order of Melchizedek.

Psalm 2:1-12

#### Awaiting the Promised Messiah

The World Is United in Its Treason Against the True God (1-3).

**The King of Zion Will Come As Promised** (4-6).

**Christ Will Be Crowned and Conquer All Countries** (7-9).

God's Son Is This Promised King (10-12).


CONCLUSION: All the world is aligned against God and His anointed One, Jesus. But God is not worried. He has installed His King in Zion who will conquer all the earth. This promised Messiah has come to Zion exactly as He said. He has been coronated through His life, death, and resurrection. This Son of God, who is the promised King is our great hope and Deliverer of everyone who hopes in Him.

### Psalm 2

Below is Psalm 2 with study notations added. Notice in particular the parallel words/phrases marked similarly with italics/bold/underlined.

Why do the *nations* rage and the *peoples* plot in vain? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, >> against the Lord and against his Anointed, saying, "Let us burst their bonds apart and cast away their cords from us." He who sits in the heavens laughs; the Lord holds them in derision. Then he will *speak to them* in his **wrath**, and *terrify them* in his **fury**, saying, "As for me, I have set my King on Zion, my holy hill." I will tell of the decree: The Lord said to me, "You are my Son; today I have begotten you. Ask of me, and I will make the **nations** your heritage, and the ends of the earth your possession. You shall break them with a rod of iron and dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel." Now therefore, O kings, be wise; be warned, O rulers of the earth. Serve the Lord with fear. and *rejoice* with trembling. Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and you perish in the way, for his wrath is quickly kindled. Blessed are all who take refuge in him (*refrain tying back to Ps 1:2*).

**The First Week of Advent**—*November 27*—*December 3* 

This litany of questions and answers may be used in personal devotions or family worship. For maximum effect, repeat them each day for the first week. You may also find it helpful to reflect upon these truths individually and to discuss them within your family or group. This type of instruction using scripted questions and answers is called catechesis.

**Read aloud Psalm 2:1-12** (text on previous page). Slowly re-read and meditate upon this song. This week you might also want to read and reflect upon the following Scriptures: John 4:25-26; 8:12; 14:1-7; Hebrews 6:13-20.
