Intro: 1:9-

- I. Paul's prayer for the Church
 - A. He mentioned this prayer in vs 3-4
 - B. Paul's prayers for the Churches seem to always express his desire for what is necessary for them to glorify God
 - 1. Eph 1:17-18 may give to you the **spirit of wisdom and revelation** *in the knowledge of Him*, Col 2:2
 - a. the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; vs 18; Ac 26:18;
 - b. that you may know
 - i. what is the hope of His calling, Eph 4:4
 - ii. what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance Eph 1:11
 - 2. Eph 3:16 that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory,
 - a. to be **strengthened with might** through His Spirit in the inner man, Eph 6:10; Php 4:19; Col 1:11,27 17 that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith;
 - b. that you, being rooted and grounded in love, Col 1:23; 2:7 may be **able to comprehend** vs 18; Ro 10:3,11-12; Eph 1:18
 - i. what is the width and length and depth and height--
 - ii. to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; vs 19
 - c. that you **may be filled** with all the fullness of God. Jo 1:16; Eph 1:23; Col 2:9-10
 - 3. Col 1:9 ... and to ask
 - a. that you may be **filled with the knowledge of His will** in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; Ro 12:2; Eph 1:8,15-16; 5:10,17; Col 1:3-4
 - b. that you may walk worthy of the Lord, Eph 4:1; Php 1:27; 1Th 2:12;
 - i. fully pleasing Him, 1Th 4:1;
 - ii. being fruitful in every good work Jo 15:16; 2Co 9:8; Php 1:11, Tit 3:1; Heb 13:21
 - iii. and increasing in the knowledge of God;

iv. strengthened with all might, - Eph 3:16; 6:10

- according to His glorious power,
- for all patience and longsuffering with joy; Ac 5:41; Ro 5:3; Eph 4:2;

C. For what does Paul Pray

- 1. As in all of his recorded prayers, he does not ask for physical needs or Church growth
- 2. He prayed for five specific things that were his passion to be realized in their lives vs 9-11
 - a. Love that your love may abound still more and more 1 Co 13:1-3
 - i. agape love, affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast:--(feast of) charity(-ably), dear, love.
 - ii. Can really only be understood from the New Testament, even the Septuagint offers little understanding of Agape love.
 - It is divine pray for that love to abound proves it's source (1 Jo 4:7-8,10,19; Ro 5:5; Gal 5:22-23; 1 Thess 4:9-10)
 - It is de facto the Philippians were already loving each other so Paul prays for it to abound still more
 - It is decisive not based on feelings, but a choice to obey
 - It is dynamic it has the capability to abound
 - -perisseuo to superabound (in quantity or quality), be in excess, be superfluous; also (transitively) to cause to superabound or excel
 - -in knowledge epignosis recognition, i.e. (by implication) full discernment, acknowledgement:--(ac-) knowledge(-ing, ment).
 - It is discerning all discernment aesthesis perception, i.e. (figuratively) discernment:--judgment.

b. Excellence

- i. that you may **approve** the things that are **excellent** Ro 2:18; 12:2; Eph 5:10;
- ii. dokimazo to test (literally or figuratively); by implication, to approve:--allow, discern, examine, X like, (ap-)prove, try.

iii. diaphero - to bear through, i.e. (literally) transport; usually to bear apart, i.e. (objectively) to toss about (figuratively, report); subjectively, to "differ", or (by implication) surpass:--be better, carry, differ from, drive up and down, be (more) excellent, make matter, publish, be of more value.

c. Integrity

- i. that you may be sincere and without offense 1Co 1:8; 1Th 3:13;
- ii. heilikrines ; judged by sunlight, i.e. tested as genuine (figuratively):--pure, sincere.
- iii. aproskopos actively, inoffensive, i.e. not leading into sin; passively, faultless, i.e. not led into sin:--none (void of, without) offence.
- iv. till the day of Christ obligatory and permanent,

d. Good Works

- i. being filled with the fruits of righteousness which are by Jesus Christ- 1Th 5:23
- ii. Pleroo to make replete, i.e. (literally) to cram (a net), level up (a hollow), or (figuratively) to furnish (or imbue, diffuse, influence), satisfy, execute (an office), finish (a period or task), verify (or coincide with a prediction), etc.:--accomplish, X after, (be) complete, end, expire, fill (up), fulfil, (be, make) full (come), fully preach, perfect, supply.
- iii. Karpos fruit (as plucked), literally or figuratively:--fruit.
- iv. Dikaiosune equity (of character or act); specially (Christian) justification:--righteousness.

- e. The Glory of God
 - i. to the glory and praise of God.
 - ii. Jo 15:4-5,8; Eph 1:12,14; 2:10; Col 1:6
