## Ananias and Sapphira: Why?

- 1. The enemy of the new people of God:
  - a. Satan is an infiltrator.

2 Corinthians 11:14 Satan disguises himself as an angel of light.

"Ananias and Sapphira wanted to join God's community while also retaining their personal autonomy from God's authority. They thereby risked infiltrating God's church with Satan's agenda." (Keener)

d. Because of the Spirit's real presence in the church, sin against the church tested the Spirit.	Joshua 7  1 Cor. 3:16-17 Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy him. For God's temple is holy, and you are that temple.
