A. Marriage is for a Purpose. (v. 18)

1. To provide companionship
It is not good that the man should be alone

Malachi 2:14

2. To help one another

I will make him an help meet for him

3. To carry on the human race

 Genesis 1:27-28
 Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth

B. Marriage is to be Monogamous.

(v. 18) I will make him an help meet

■ Ephesians 5:31

C. Marriage is to be Heterosexual.

(v. 22) ... made he a woman, and brought her unto the man.

D. Marriage is very Good.

• Genesis 1:27, 31

 (v. 31) And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good.

II. Marriage is a Growing Relationship.

Genesis 2:24

A. Marriage involves Leaving.

Therefore shall a man <u>leave</u> his father and his mother

The leaving is more than geographical leaving.

- 1. It means your spouse comes first.
- 2. It means assuming financial responsibility.
- B. Marriage involves Cleaving. and shall cleave unto his wife
- C. Marriage involves Weaving. and they shall be one flesh
- The three words leaving, cleaving, & weaving present the idea of permanency.
