Tells the story of the “second exodus.” Two returns are recorded, one led by Zerubbabel, one by Ezra. 60 years between the two accounts, during which time Esther lives and rules in Persia.</p> <p>Ezra (“help”) a direct priestly descendant of Aaron. A scribe and teacher. Contemporary of Nehemiah. Also living in the time of this book (538-425 BC) is Gautama Buddha of India, Confucius of China , and Socrates in Greece. Chronology of the era: Zerubbabel, 538-515, first return (Ezra 1-6); Esther, 483-473 (Book of Esther); Ezra. 457, second return (Ezra 7-10); Nehemiah, 444-425, third return (Book of Nehemiah).</p> <p>Background Persian kings: Cyrus, Cambyses, Smerdis, Darius I, Ahasuerus (Xerxes), Artaxerxes, Darius II.</p> <p>CHRIST: The fulfillment of “return” passages shows that Messiah is indeed coming to BETHLEHEM of JUDAH, not BABYLON.</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">QUESTIONS, EZRA</p> <p>1.
