WLC Q. 7. What is God? A. God is a Spirit, in and of himself infinite in being, glory, blessedness, and perfection; all-sufficient, eternal, unchangeable, incomprehensible, everywhere present, almighty, knowing all things, most wise, most holy, most just, most merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in goodness and truth. **WLC Q. 25.** Wherein consisteth the sinfulness of that estate whereinto man fell? A. ... he is utterly indisposed, disabled, and made opposite unto all that is spiritually good, and wholly inclined to all evil, and that continually; which is commonly called Original Sin, and from which do proceed all actual transgressions. **WLC Q. 145.** What are the sins forbidden in the ninth commandment? A. ...calling evil good, and good evil... **WLC Q. 148.** What are the sins forbidden in the tenth commandment? A. ...and grieving at the good of our neighbor... **WLC Q. 105.** What are the sins forbidden in the first commandment? A. The sins forbidden in the first commandment are atheism, in denying, or not having a God; idolatry,...and ascribing the praise of any good we either are, have, or can do, to fortune, idols, ourselves, or any other creature...praying, or giving any religious worship, to saints, angels, or any other creatures

WLC Q. 105. What are the sins forbidden in the first commandment? A. ...resisting and grieving of his Spirit, discontent and impatience at his dispensations, charging him foolishly for the evils he inflicts on us [Psalm 73:2-3,13-15,22]... **WLC Q. 142.** What are the sins forbidden in the eighth commandment? A. ...envying at the prosperity of others [Psalm 73:3]... **WLC Q. 81.** Are all true believers at all times assured of their present being in the estate of grace, and that they shall be saved? A. Assurance of grace and salvation not being of the essence of faith, true believers may wait long before they obtain it; and, after the enjoyment thereof, may have it weakened and intermitted, through manifold distempers, sins, temptations, and desertions; yet are they never left without such a presence and support of the Spirit of God, as keeps them from sinking into utter despair [Psalm 73:15, 23]. **WLC Q. 113.** What are the sins forbidden in the third commandment? A. ...being ashamed of it, or a shame to it, by unconformable [Psalm 73:14-15], unwise, unfruitful and offensive walking, or backsliding from it.
